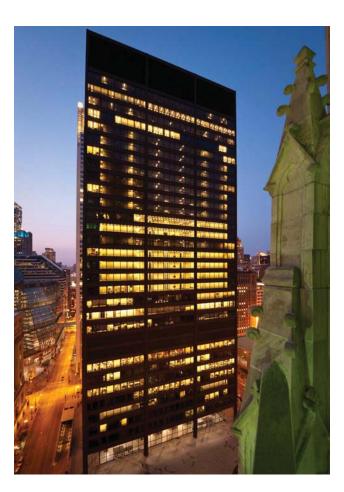

I am pleased to provide you with the Public Building Commission's Quarterly Staff Report. The report is intended to communicate current project status and performance metrics on a regular basis, promoting the highest level of accountability and transparency.

Because these reports offer cumulative performance data, this report reflects year-end statistics and accomplishments for 2014. It demonstrates how the PBC remains committed to the stewardship of the public fund through exemplary cost and schedule control. These control measures allow for consistent delivery of quality public facilities, either new or renovated, and significant infrastructure and technology projects, on time and under budget while also furthering a commitment to both environmental and economic sustainability.

Providing 21st century learning environments for learners of all ages in 2014, the PBC successfully delivered two school additions at Bell and Coonley Elementary Schools, a new Albany Park Branch Library and the renovation of the existing Jones College Prep High School. The PBC also completed the stabilization of the landmark Stockyards Bank building along with 21 technology and infrastructure projects.

PBC is proud to develop public facilities that help strengthen and improve neighborhoods and that serve as community anchors for generations to come. Beyond projects completed in 2014, I am also pleased to let you know that PBC has a diverse portfolio of 13 projects in construction with an additional nine in planning and development. These include the world-class Chinatown Branch Library, two new elementary schools and eight school addition or modernization projects. Beyond capital construction projects, our work includes regional energy, technology and planning projects throughout the metropolitan Chicago area ranging from energy conservation work and enhanced security networks to unique suburban municipal projects fostering economic development and transit access improvements.

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Executive Summary Report

Below are the highlights from the 2014 Year End Staff Report.

1. Executive Summary Report

The details included in 2014 Year End Staff Report are intended to communicate project status and performance metrics on the PBC's completed projects. The metrics are reported quarterly, culminating in the Year End Staff Report published each year.

In 2014, PBC completed 5 capital construction projects and 21 technology and infrastructure projects. They include:

- Albany Park Branch Library
- Alexander Graham Bell Elementary School Addition
- John C. Coonley Elementary School Addition
- William Jones College Preparatory High School Renovation
- Stockyards Bank Stabilization
- Regional technology and infrastructure projects, including camera and fiber installations and upgrades

2. Program Cost Performance

The PBC is committed to cost efficient delivery of our projects. We manage costs over the life of the project and work closely with our clients throughout the development of a project to ensure that only the funds necessary to complete a project are needed.

Multi-Year Program Cost Status Report

At year's end, the PBC's multi-year program authority for projects completed and in development exceeds \$2.8 billion. Projects included in the multi-year program are trending under budget by 10.53%, representing a variance of \$299 million under the current budgets.

2014 Project Completions Cost Status Report

For projects completed in 2014 (including the capital construction and infrastructure & technology programs,) the PBC's total Budget Authority was \$89.7M in project development costs. At year's end, completed projects are trending under budget by 11.31%, representing a variance of \$10.2M under the current budgets, even including a limited number of later scope changes.

3. Program Cost Effectiveness Report

In addition to managing projects to approved budgets and delivering projects as good stewards of the public funds, the PBC also focuses on the management of change orders and indirect project costs to maximize cost effectiveness.

Construction Change Order Year End Report

The approved Change Order % for recently completed projects and those currently in construction is 2.6%. The projected change order % for these projects is 3%. Projected Change Orders include those currently in process for approval as well as forecasted potential change orders. These rates are within the industry standard change order percentage of 3-5% for new municipal and educational construction work. The PBC's current program also includes renovation projects, which typically have a higher change order percentage than new construction.

Indirect Costs as a Percentage of Construction Costs

The PBC tracks all project costs throughout the life of a project, including Indirect Costs, also known as "soft costs" (Planning, Design Program and Project Management, Environmental Testing & Consulting) as well as all Construction Costs, also known as "hard costs" (Demolition, Site Prep, Utility Relocation, and General Construction.)

The PBC's Indirect Costs average 16.36% of construction. This is consistently below the industry average of 25%.

Indirect Costs are particularly cost effective on large scale projects and programs. The PBC averages 13.63% of construction costs on projects where construction is \$50M or higher, 16.07% on projects where construction is \$20M-50M, and 23.07% on projects where construction is \$1M-\$20M. The larger the project, the lower the indirect costs.

Market Conditions Report

This report illustrates comparative costs of like buildings, thereby tracking market trends.

4. Year End Project Status Report

This report provides a detailed snapshot on the projects completed in 2014 and provides a look ahead projects completed in 2015 and beyond.

5. Environmental Sustainability Report

Through the end of 2014, PBC had achieved LEED Certification on 67 facilities, bringing the total number of LEED-certified, municipally-owned facilities to 87. This surpassed Mayor Emanuel's goal of doubling the number of LEED-certified municipal buildings in the City more than a year ahead of schedule. In 2014, PBC achieved LEED Certification on eight facilities, including the PBC's 4th LEED Platinum facility.

Additionally, the PBC remains committed to renewable energy strategies. To date, PBC has installed geothermal systems at 16 buildings, installed 75 solar thermal panels at 6 buildings, and building integrated photovoltaics or panels at 2 buildings with another 5 buildings made PV-ready.

6. Economic Sustainability Report

The PBC is committed to economic sustainability and includes provisions for Minority and Women Owned Business (M/WBE) Participation and Workforce (Equal Employment Opportunity) goals in our contracts. M/WBE and EEO Commitments and Hiring Goals are reported to the Board at the time of contract award. The PBC tracks compliance throughout the life of a project on both Construction and Professional Services contracts.

M/WBE Compliance for Projects Completed in 2014

Through year's end, a combined total of **33.96%** M/WBE Participation has been achieved on projects completed in 2014.

In addition to project level professional services, the PBC also tracks compliance on program-wide professional administrative services. These professional services are not project specific and include but are not limited to: Financial Services, Information Technology, Insurance Broker Services, Legal / IG, Office Management, Payroll, Staffing, and Property Management.

M/WBE Compliance Report for Professional Administrative Services Paid in 2014 A combined total of **51.21%** M/WBE Participation was achieved on professional administrative services paid in 2014.

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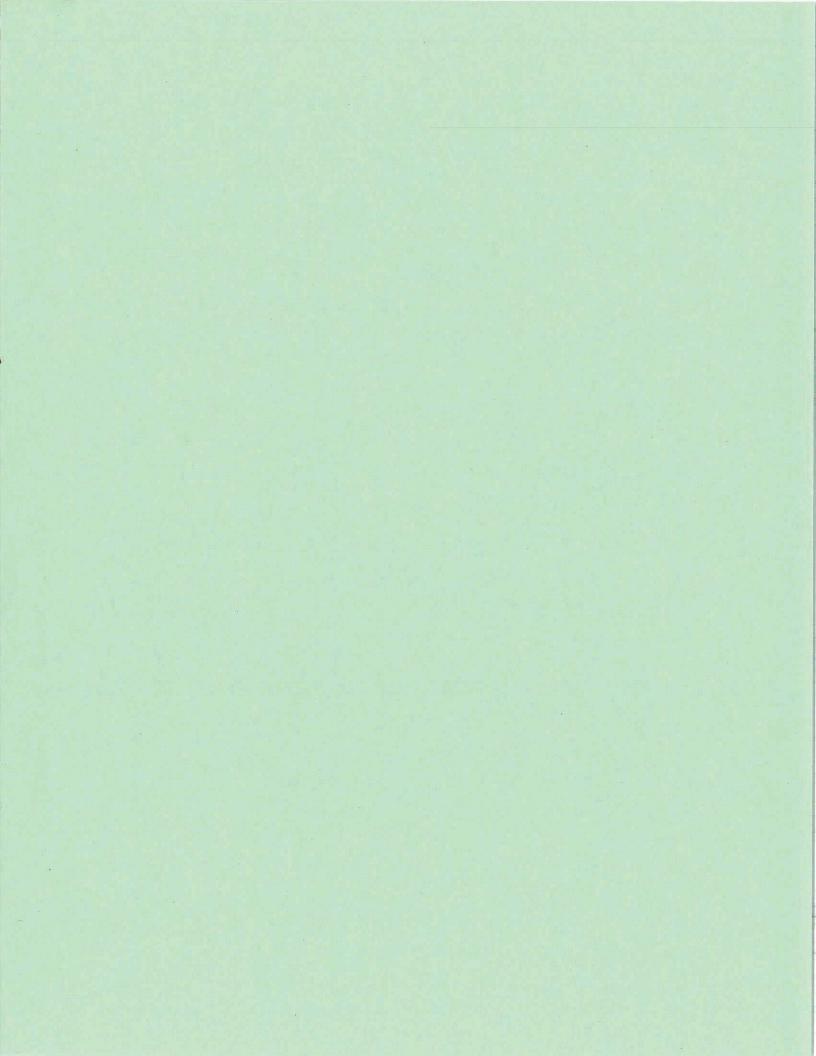

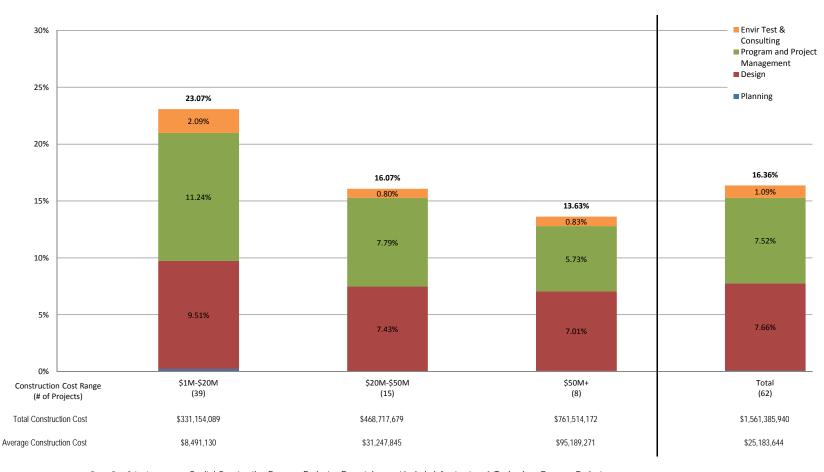

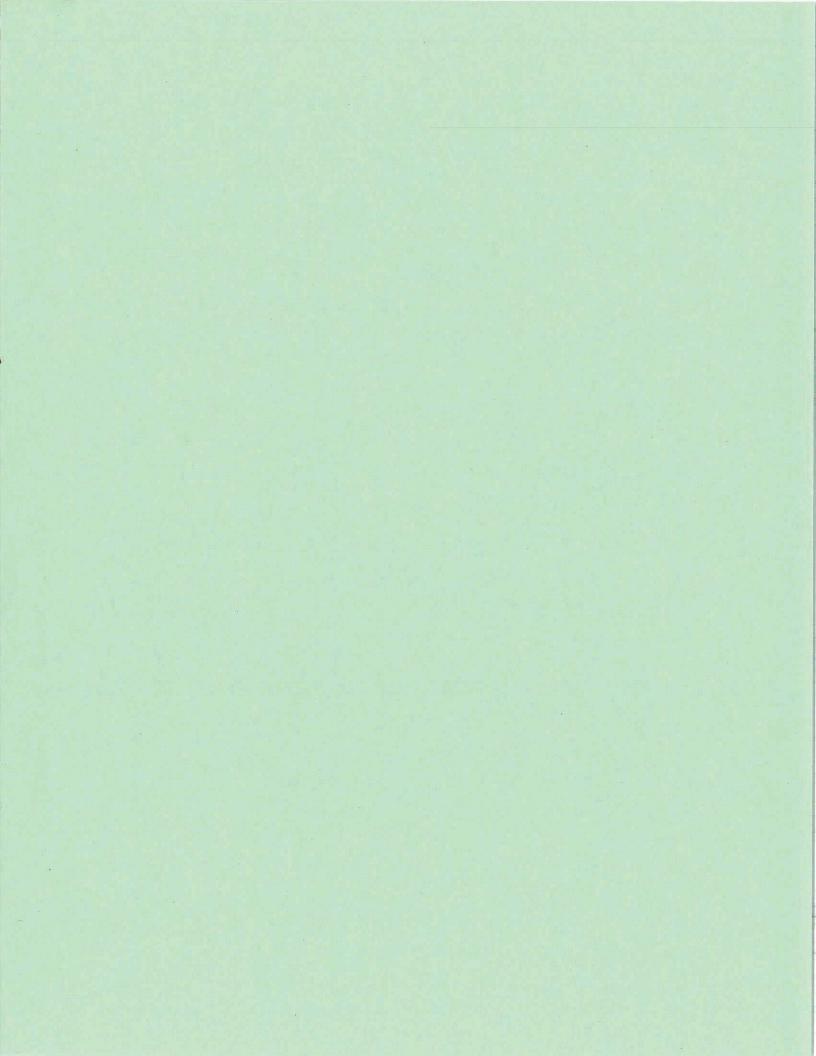

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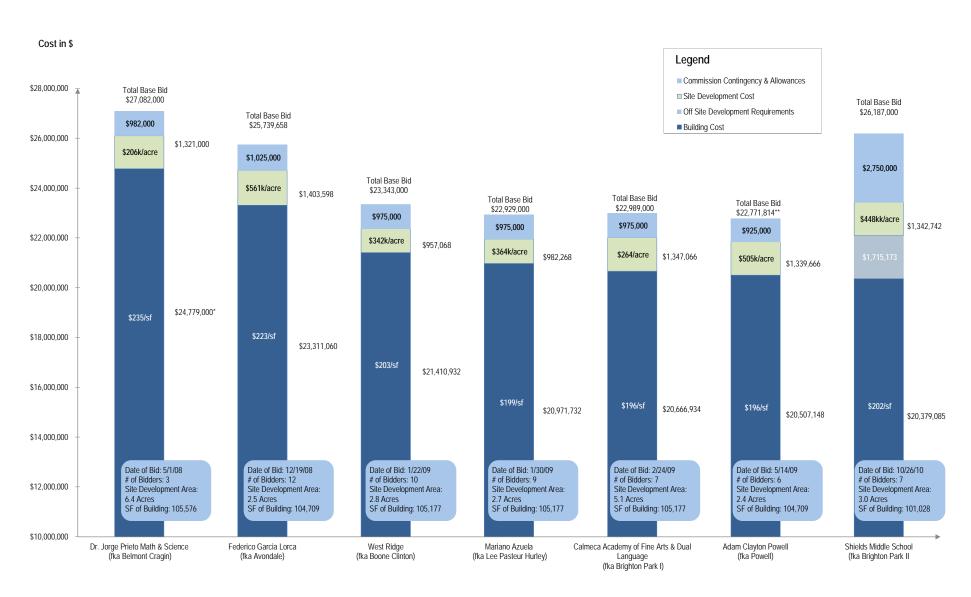
Market Conditions Report - Prototype High Schools (04 2014)





Market Conditions Report - Prototype Elementary Schools (Q4 2014)



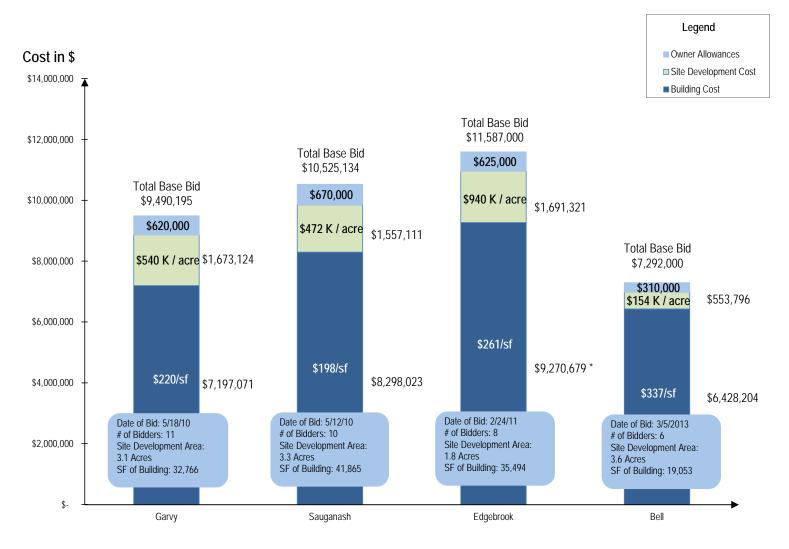

Market Conditions Report - Elementary School Additions (Q4 2014)



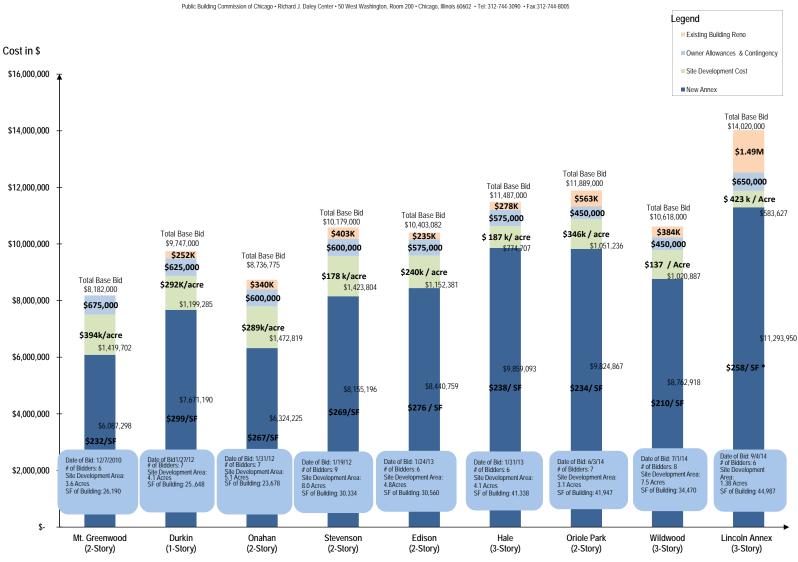

Market Conditions Report - Elementary School Annexes (Q4 2014)





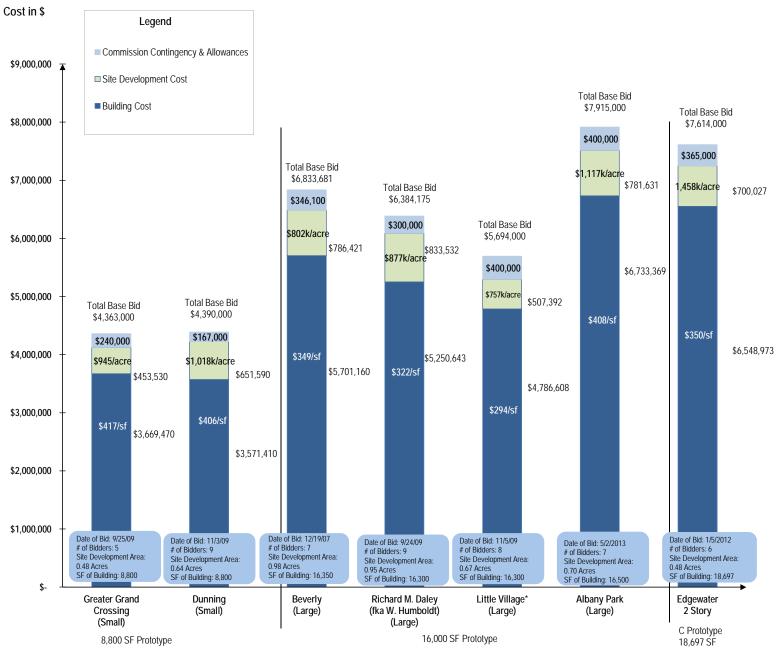

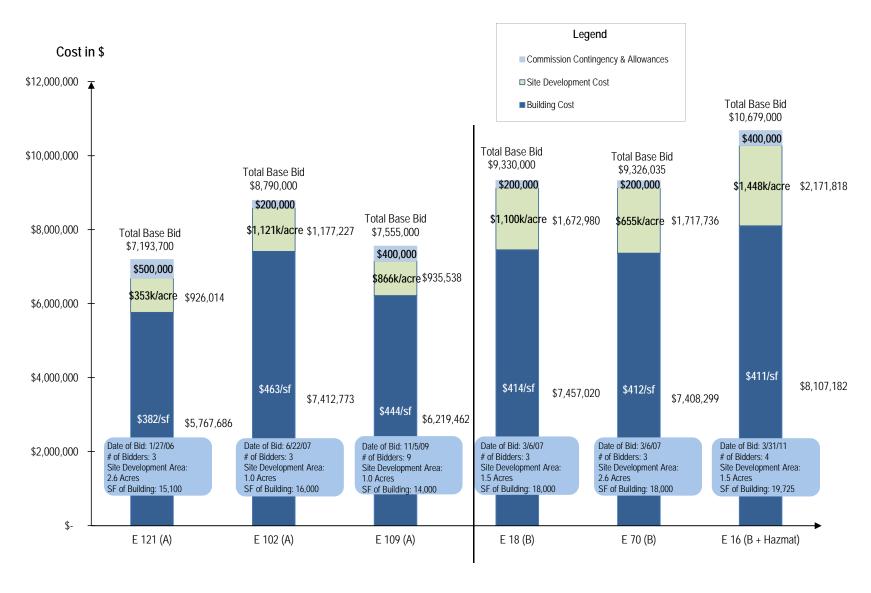
Market Conditions Report - Prototype Libraries (Q4 2014)





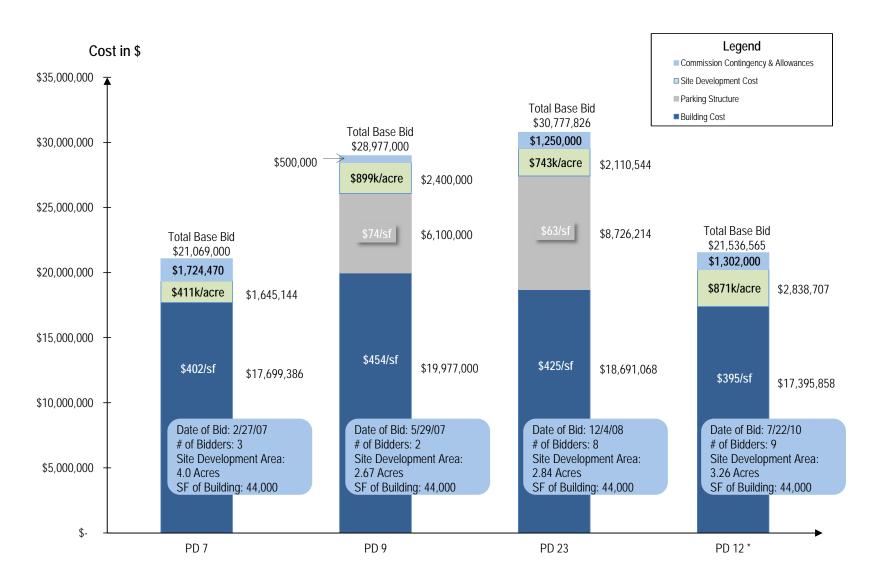
Market Conditions Report - Prototype Fire Houses (Q4 2014)





Market Conditions Report -Prototype Police Stations (Q4 2014)

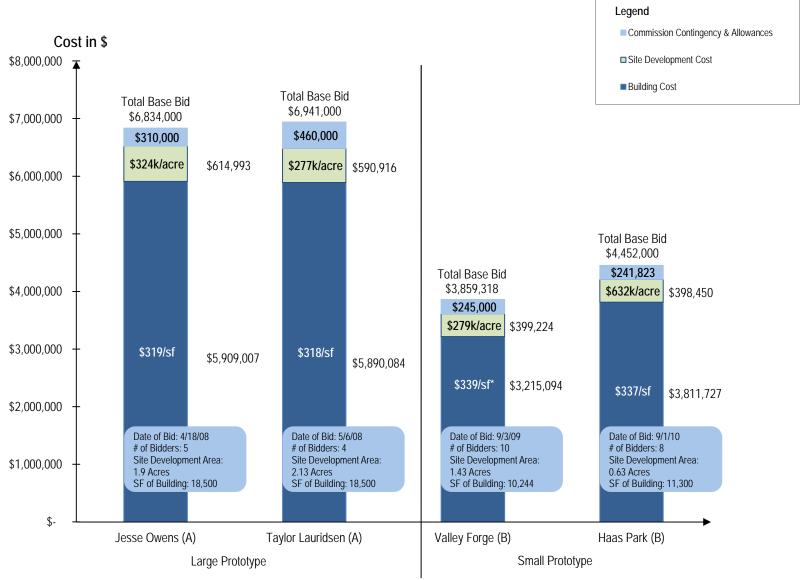

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The PBC completed a variety of projects for client agencies to help improve public safety and increase network capabilities and communications. The PBC's total Budget Authority for Infrastructure & Technology Program completions in 2014 was \$39.7M in project development costs. At year's end, the completed Program is trending under budget by 22.03%, representing a variance of \$8.9M under the current budget, even including a limited number of later scope changes.

The PBC worked to install equipment and software programs to enhance security throughout the City of Chicago and Cook County, using technology to increase public safety while simultaneously offering a greater cost savings to the City and County and enabling user agencies to be more efficient in their work. In all, 352 new cameras were installed in 2014. To date, we have installed more than 4,700 cameras throughout the City of Chicago and Cook County that serve the needs of each individual client agency.

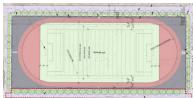

Sustainability Program

In line with its mission and vision, the Public Building Commission of Chicago (PBC) has developed 67 LEED certified facilities, with an additional 21 LEED registered projects in development, and is managing programs to install Energy Conservation Measures across a broad range of City of Chicago and Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) facilities. Additionally, the City of Chicago and Sister Agencies, including the PBC, together have achieved LEED Certification on 87 municipally owned facilities. The June 2011 commitment to double the number of LEED certified facilities was achieved in the first quarter of 2014, well ahead of schedule.

Additionally, the PBC remains committed to renewable energy strategies. To date, PBC has installed geothermal systems at 16 buildings, installed 75 solar thermal panels at 6 buildings, and building integrated photovoltaics or panels at 2 buildings with another 5 buildings made PV-ready.

The Daley Center achieved LEED EB O+M Silver certification in May 2012 based on building performance over a year-long performance period. The PBC sought LEED EB O+M certification to align with overall sustainability goals, and demonstrate that LEED EB O+M can be achieved in municipally owned, large assembly use buildings. LEED EB O+M brings together and codifies all of the sustainability efforts that PBC has undertaken over the past 15 years for the Daley Center. Energy and water saving initiatives originally implemented as part of Energy Star and Guaranteed Performance Contract efforts support the LEED EB O+M effort. LEED EB O+M also provides a framework for sustainable building operation and maintenance strategies and policies that have been implemented at the Daley Center.

Multi-Agency Energy Performance Contract Program

PBC is managing a multi-agency energy performance contract program, utilizing Energy Service Companies (ESCOs) to reduce energy use and carbon footprint across the City of Chicago and Cook County. The program is designed to leverage long term utility savings to pay for energy-related capital improvements. ESCOs are deployed to identify, design, implement and guarantee the performance of Energy Conservation Measures (ECMs) - that achieve significant long term savings that can be measured and verified. ECM projects can be financed with no capital outlay. Rebates and other incentives may also be accessed to supplement project funding. The program is currently underway in two forums: Retrofit Chicago and MWRD/PBC Energy Efficiency Program.

Retrofit Chicago

Out of an initial list of 238 City of Chicago facilities, an initial feasibility analysis on 148 buildings was completed in November 2012. Investment Grade Energy Audits were performed on 112 of these facilities, and 60 buildings were ultimately identified as suitable candidates for inclusion in Retrofit One, the first phase of Retrofit Chicago. Retrofit One, a \$12.8M project, approved by City Council on January 15, 2014, is guaranteed to save at least \$1.4 million in annual utility energy costs, with additional operations and maintenance benefits also expected. Project implementation, undertaken by three ESCOs, commenced April 2014 and will be substantially complete in the 2nd quarter of 2015.

MWRD / PBC Energy Efficiency Program

A preliminary feasibility study was completed to assess opportunities for implementing ECMs across Metropolitan Water Reclamation District (MWRD) wastewater treatment plant buildings. Three ESCO's analyzed the Terrance O'Brien Wastewater Treatment Plant in Skokie, Illinois. Based on their feasibility analyses, an MWRD evaluation committee recommended that MWRD proceed with the next phase of the planning process. In March 2014, the MWRD Board of Commissioners granted approval for the PBC to lead a full audit process. One ESCO was selected to perform Investment Grade Audits of all MWRD treatment plant buildings. The 40% complete audit results, presented in December 2014, confirmed significant opportunities for Energy Conservation Measures (ECMs.) The audit will be complete in the 1st quarter of 2015.
