The current design includes a number of electrical receptacles intended to provide power to 'plug-in' welding machines utilized in the repair of municipal vehicles. The specification for these receptacles was based upon information provided by the Department of Fleet Management during the Design Development phase of the project. At that time, we had intended to relocate existing equipment from our aged facility at 3812 S. Iron Street.

We have since learned that this equipment is obsolete and has been superseded by models with more efficient and safer power requirements, in accordance with current industry standards. We will be unable to relocate & reuse this equipment which was manufactured over 45 years ago and is no longer supported; repair parts are no longer available and it cannot be upgraded. Further, we are advised that the specified receptacles are no longer readily available.

The Department of Fleet Management requests that the current design for this application be revised to comply with contemporary industry standards and also request that the following new equipment be incorporated into the scope-of-work for this project:

- (2) Miller Gold Star Model 452 welding machines (Miller #903374)
- (2) Standard Running Gear Wheeled Base (Miller #042886)
- (2) Air Filter Kit (Miller #042939)

These specific items are requested so as to match existing equipment utilized at our other, more modern, Vehicle Maintenance Facilities.


