Daley Center, 50 West Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois 60602, (the "**Commission**"), and **Civil & Environmental Consultants, Inc.** with offices at 3041 Woodcreek Drive, Suite 210, Downers Grove, Illinois (the "**Consultant**").

#### **Background Information – Recitals:**

Whereas, The Commission on behalf of the City of Chicago (referred to in this Agreement as the "User Agency"), intends to undertake the construction and/or improvement of the following facility or facilities in Chicago, Illinois described in Schedule A attached to the Agreement (the "Project"):

#### BRIGHTON PARK II AREA ELEMENTARY SCHOOL - PS 1419

Whereas, the Commission requires certain professional services described in the Agreement, in connection with the Project and desires to retain the Consultant on the terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement to perform such Services. The Consultant desires to be so retained by the Commission and has represented to the Commission that the Consultant has the knowledge, skill, experience and other resources necessary to perform the Services in the manner provided by the Agreement.

Whereas, the Consultant has consulted with the Commission and the User Agency, made site inspections, and taken such other actions as the Consultant deemed necessary or advisable to make itself fully acquainted with the scope and requirements of the Project and the Services. The Consultant represents that it is qualified and competent by education, training and experience to prepare drawings, specifications and construction documents necessary to complete the Project in accordance with standards of reasonable professional skill and diligence.

Whereas, the Commission has relied upon the Consultant's representations in selecting the Consultant.

# TERMS AND CONDITIONS - ENVIRONMENTAL CONSULTING

- 1. <u>Definitions.</u> The following phrases have the same meanings for purposes of this
- a. Agreement means this professional services agreement for environmental consulting services, including all exhibits or documents attached hereto and/or incorporated by reference herein, and all amendments, modifications, or revisions made in accordance with the terms hereof.
- b. Commission as herein referred to shall include the Public Building Commission of Chicago, the Commission's Chairman, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Executive Director, Director of Construction, Managing Architect, Project Manager, or designated consultant or consultants, acting on behalf thereof, as designated by the Commission in writing, for the purpose of giving authorizations, instructions, and/or approval pursuant to this Agreement.
- c. Contract Documents consists of all of the component parts of the Contract between the Commission and the General Contractor for the construction and improvement of the Project including, without modifications thereto.
- d. Consultant means the company or other entity identified in this agreement, and such successors or assigns, if any, as may be authorized by the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- e. **Key Personnel** means those job titles and persons as identified in those positions as identified in Consultant's proposal and accepted by the Commission.
- f. Project means the construction and/or improvement of the facility or facilities specified
- g. **Services** means, collectively, the services, duties and responsibilities that are necessary to allow the Consultant to provide the Services required by the Commission under this agreement.
- h. **Sub-consultant** means a firm hired by the Consultant to perform professional services related to the construction and/or improvement of the Project.
- i. **Technical Personnel** as herein referred to include partners, officers and all other personnel of the Consultant, including technical typists assigned to the Project, exclusive of general office employees.
- j. **User Agency** means the municipal corporation that requested the Commission to undertake the construction and/or improvement of the Project.
- 2. <u>Incorporation of Documents.</u> The documents identified below in this paragraph are hereby incorporated in and made a part of this Agreement. By executing this Agreement, Consultant acknowledges and agrees that Consultant is familiar with the contents of each of such documents and will comply fully with all applicable portions thereof in performing the Services.
- a. <u>Project Documents.</u> The plans and specifications for the Project, to the extent that plans and specifications for the Project have been prepared, as set forth and described in this Agreement (the "Project

Documents"),

b. <u>Policies Concerning MBE and WBE.</u> The Commission's policies concerning utilization of minority business enterprises ("MBE") and women business enterprises ("WBE"), as the same may be revised from time to time.

# Engagement and Standards for Performing Services.

- a. <u>Engagement.</u> The Commission hereby engages the Consultant, and the Consultant hereby accepts such engagement, to provide the Services described in this agreement, as the same may be amended, in writing, from time to time by mutual agreement of the Commission and the Consultant.
- b. <u>Performance Standard.</u> The Consultant represents and agrees that the Services performed under this Agreement will proceed with efficiency, promptness and diligence and will be executed in a competent and thorough manner, in accordance with reasonable professional standards in the field consistent with that degree of skill and care ordinarily exercised by practicing environmental consulting professionals performing services of a scope, purpose, and magnitude comparable with the Services to be provided under this Agreement. If problem that may impact the performance of the Services or the Project, Consultant shall promptly provide notice to the Commission. The Consultant further promises that it will assign at all times during the term of the Agreement the number of experienced, appropriately trained employees necessary for the Consultant to perform the Services in the manner required by the Agreement.
- c. <u>Consultant's Personnel</u>. Consultant must ensure that all Services that require the exercise of professional skills or judgment are accomplished by professionals qualified and competent in the applicable discipline and appropriately licensed, if required by law. Consultant must maintain current copies of any such licenses and provide these copies upon request by the Commission. Consultant remains responsible for the professional and technical accuracy of all Services furnished, whether by the Consultant or others on its behalf. All deliverables will be prepared in a form and content satisfactory to the Commission and delivered in a timely manner consistent with the requirements of the Agreement.
- d. <u>Confidentiality</u>. Consultant acknowledges that it is entrusted with or has access to valuable and confidential information and records of the Commission and User Agency. Consultant must at all times use it best efforts on behalf of the Commission to assure timely and satisfactory rendering and completion of its Services. Consultant must at all times act in the best interests of the Commission and User Agency consistent with Consultant's professional obligations assumed by Consultant in entering into this Agreement. Consultant promises to commission's and User Agency's interests. Consultant must perform all Services in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, to the reasonable satisfaction of the Commission.
- e. <u>Independent Contractor</u>. In performing the Services under this Agreement, Consultant shall at all times be an independent contractor, and does not and must not act or represent itself as an agent or responsible for determining the means and methods for performing the Services. The Agreement will not be construed as an agreement of partnership, joint venture, or agency.
- f. <u>Limitations on Sub-Consultants</u>. Consultant must not use any business or individual who is disqualified by the Commission or debarred under any other governmental agency's procedures to provide the Services under the Agreement.

- g. Failure to Meet Performance Standard. If the Consultant fails to comply with its obligations under the standards of the Agreement, the Consultant must perform again, at its own expense, all payment for any of the Services by the Commission does not relieve Consultant of its responsibility to render the Services and deliverables with the professional skill and care and technical accuracy required by the Agreement. This provision in no way limits the Commission's rights against the Consultant, either under the Agreement, at law or in equity.
- h. <u>Changes to the Services</u>. The Commission may from time to time, request changes to the terms of the Agreement or in the Scope of Services of the Consultant to be performed hereunder. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of compensation and revisions to the duration of the Services, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the Commission and Consultant, shall be incorporated in a written amendment to this Agreement. The Commission shall not be liable for any changes absent such written amendment.

# Duties and Obligations of Consultant

- a. <u>Nondiscrimination.</u> The Consultant agrees that in performing this Agreement it shall not discriminate against any worker, employee or applicant for employment, or any member of the public, because of race, creed, gender, color, national origin or disability, or otherwise commit an unfair labor practice. Attention is called to applicable provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 88-352, July 2, 1964, 78 Stat. 241 et. <u>Seq.</u> the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. 12010 et. <u>Seq.</u> the Illinois Human Rights Act 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et. <u>Seq.</u> and the Public Works Employment Discrimination Act 775 ILCS 10/0.0 1 through 10/20, inclusive and a Resolution passed by the Board of Commissioners of the Public Building Commission of Chicago on October 1, 2004, concerning participation of Minority Business Enterprises and Women Business Enterprises on contracts awarded by the Commission. The Consultant will furnish such reports and information as requested by the Commission and the Illinois Department of Human Relations or any other administrative or governmental entity overseeing the enforcement, administration or compliance with the above referenced laws and regulations.
- b. Employment Procedures, Preferences and Compliances. Salaries of employees of Consultant performing work under this Agreement shall be paid unconditionally and not less often than once a month without deduction or rebate on any account except only such payroll deductions as are mandatory or permitted by the applicable law or regulations. Attention is called to Illinois Compiled Statutes, 1992 relating to Wages and Hours including 820 ILCS 130/0.01 through 130/12 thereof (Prevailing Wage Act), 30 ILCS 570/1 through 570/7 (Employment of Illinois Workers on Public Works Act) and 30 ILCS 560/0.01 through 560/7 (Public Works Preference Act). The Consultant shall comply with all applicable "Anti-Kickback" laws and regulations, including the "Anti-Kickback" Act of June 13, 1934 (48 Stat. 948; 62 Stat. 740; 63 Stat. 108; 18 U.S.C. § 874; 40 U.S.C. § 276c) and the Indirect kickback, the Commission shall withhold from the Consultant, out of payments due to it, an amount sufficient to pay employees underpaid the difference between the salaries required hereby to be paid and the salaries actually paid and on account of the Consultant to the respective employees to whom they are due.
- c. <u>Compliance with Policies Concerning MBE and WBE.</u> Without limiting the generality of the requirements of the policies of the Commission referred to in paragraph 2 above, the Consultant agrees to use best efforts to utilize minority business enterprises for not less than twenty five percent (25%) for MBE and five percent (5%) for WBE of the value of the Services, in accordance with the Resolution passed by the Board of Commissioners of the Commission on October 1, 2004, concerning participation of minority business enterprises and women business enterprises on contracts awarded by the Commission and to furnish to the Commission, such reports and other

information concerning compliance with such Resolution as may be requested by the Commission from time to time.

- d. <u>Delays.</u> The Consultant agrees that no charges for damages or claims for damages shall be asserted by it against the Commission for any delays or hindrances from any cause whatsoever during the progress of complete the Services. Such delays or hindrances, if any, shall be compensated for by an extension of time to complete the Services, for such reasonable period as may be mutually agreed upon between the parties, it being understood, however, that the agreement of the Commission to allow the Consultant to complete the Services or any part of them after the time provided for the completion thereof herein shall in no way operate as a waiver on the part of the Commission of any of its rights hereunder.
- e. <u>Records.</u> The Consultant shall maintain accurate and complete records of expenditures, costs and time incurred by Consultant in connection with the Project and the Services. Such records shall be maintained in accordance with recognized commercial accounting practices. The Commission may examine such records at Consultant's offices upon reasonable notice during normal business hours. Consultant shall retain all such records for a period of not less than five calendar years after the termination of this Agreement.
- f. <u>Time of Essence.</u> The Consultant acknowledges and agrees that time is of the essence in the performance of this Agreement and that timely completion of the Services is vital to the completion of the Project by the Commission. Consultant agrees to use its best efforts to expedite performance of the Services and performance of all other obligations of the Consultant under this Agreement and any other agreements entered into by the Commission which are managed or administered by the Consultant as a result of the Consultant's engagement hereunder.
- g. <u>Compliance with Laws.</u> In performing its engagement under this Agreement, the Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, including but not limited to, those referenced in subparagraphs (a) and (b) above and in the documents referred to in paragraph 2 of this Agreement.
- h. <u>Progress Meetings.</u> Meetings to discuss the progress of the Project and/or to review the performance of the Consultant may be scheduled upon the Commission's request, at mutually agreeable times and locations, and the Consultant agrees to cause such meetings to be attended by appropriate personnel of the Consultant engaged in performing or knowledgeable of the Services.
- i. <u>Defects in Project.</u> The Consultant shall notify the Commission immediately in the event the Consultant obtains knowledge of a defect in the Project or circumstances which could result in a Project delay or cost overrun.

#### 5. <u>Term.</u>

- a. The term of this Agreement shall begin upon the final execution of this Agreement, and, subject to the provisions of subparagraph (b) below, shall expire upon completion of the Services and acceptance thereof by the Commission or, if the Services are of an ongoing nature, on the completion date specified in such Request for Services. The Commission and the Consultant may, from time to time, by mutual agreement, extend the term of this Agreement by amending this Agreement.
- b. The Commission shall have the right, at any time, to terminate the term of this Agreement, with or without cause, by written notice given to the Consultant at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of termination. In addition, the Commission shall have the right, at any time and from time to time, with or without cause, to suspend the performance of the Consultant hereunder with respect to all or any part of

the Services, by written notice given to the Consultant at least five (5) days prior to the effective date of suspension. Termination or suspension of this Agreement shall not relieve the Consultant from liability for the performance of any obligation of the Consultant under this Agreement performed or to have been performed by the Consultant on or before the effective date of termination or suspension. Provided the Consultant is not in Consultant, in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, all compensation and reimbursements due to the Consultant for periods up to the effective date of termination or suspension. In no event shall the Commission be liable to the Consultant for any loss, cost or damage which the Consultant or any other party may sustain by reason of the Commission terminating or suspending this Agreement as provided herein; provided, however, that Commission may, in its sole discretion, reimburse the Consultant for actual expenses approved by the

- c. If the Project, in whole or substantial part, is stopped for a period longer than thirty (30) days under an order of any court or other governmental authority having jurisdiction of the Project, or as a result of an act of government, such as a declaration of national emergency making materials unavailable, through no act or fault of the Consultant, or if the Commission fails to make any payment or perform any other obligation hereunder, the Consultant shall have the right to terminate this agreement, by written notice given to the from the Commission all compensation and reimbursements due to the Consultant for periods up to the effective date of termination.
- 6. <u>Compensation of Consultant; Reimbursement for Expenses.</u> The Commission shall compensate the Consultant for the Services in the manner set forth Schedule C of this Agreement. In addition, the Commission shall, upon submission of detailed invoices by the Consultant, no more frequently than once every 30 days, and approval by the Commission of those invoices, reimburse the Consultant for all Reimbursable Expenses. As used in this paragraph, the term "Reimbursable Expenses" shall mean those expenses identified as such in this Agreement.
- 7. Rights and Obligations of Commission. In connection with the administration of the Project by the Commission and the performance of this Agreement by the Consultant, the Commission shall have the following rights and obligations, in addition to those provided elsewhere in this Agreement:
- a. <u>Information</u>. The Commission shall provide the Consultant all reasonably requested information concerning the Commission's requirements for the Project and the Services.
- b. Review of Documents. Subject to the provisions of subparagraph 4 (d) above, the Commission agrees to make a reasonable effort to examine documents submitted by the Consultant and render decisions pertaining thereto with reasonable promptness.
- c. <u>Site Data.</u> To the extent the Commission determines to be necessary for the Consultant to perform the Services, the Commission may furnish, or may authorize the Consultant to obtain from a company or companies approved by the Commission as Reimbursable Expenses: (i) a certified survey of the site or sites; (ii) information concerning locations, dimensions and data pertaining to existing buildings and other improvements; (iii) title information; (iv) information concerning available service and utility lines; and (v) results of test borings and other information concerning subsoil conditions.
  - d. <u>Tests and Reports.</u> To the extent required for the Consultant to perform the Services,

the Commission may furnish structural, civil, chemical, mechanical, soil mechanical and/or other tests and reports; however, the Commission may authorize the Consultant to procure such tests and reports from Sub-Consultants, which must be approved by the Commission. The costs of such Sub-Consultants shall be payable as Reimbursable Expenses.

- e. <u>Legal, Auditing and other Services.</u> The Commission shall arrange and pay for such legal, auditing, insurance counseling and other services as the Commission, in its sole discretion, may determine to be required for the Project. Such payments shall not include legal or auditing expenses arising out of or relating to any errors or omissions, or claimed errors or omissions, of Consultant.
- f. <u>Designated Representatives.</u> The Commission may designate, at its sole discretion, one or more representatives authorized to act in its behalf.
- g. <u>Ownership of Documents.</u> All documents, data, studies and reports prepared by the Consultant or any party engaged by the Consultant, pertaining to the Project and/or the Services shall be the property of the Commission including copyrights.
- h. <u>Audits.</u> The Commission shall have the right to audit the books of the Consultant on all subjects relating to the Project and/or the Services.
- 8. <u>Indemnification of Commission.</u> The Consultant hereby agrees to indemnify, keep and save harmless the Commission and the User Agency and their respective commissioners, board members, officers, agents, officials and employees from and against all claims, demands, suits, losses, costs and expenses, including but not limited to, the fees and expenses of attorneys, that may arise out of or be based on any injury to persons or property that is or is claimed to be the result of an error, omission or act of the Consultant or any person employed by the Consultant to the maximum extent permitted by applicable law.
- 9. <u>Insurance to be Maintained by Consultant.</u> The Consultant shall purchase and maintain at all times during the performance of Services hereunder, for the benefit of the Commission, the User Agency and the Consultant, insurance coverage as set forth in Schedule D of this agreement

#### 10. Default.

- a. <u>Events of Default.</u> Any one or more of the following occurrences shall constitute an Event of Default under this Agreement:
  - i. Failure or refusal on the part of the Consultant duly to observe or perform any obligation or agreement on the part of the Consultant contained in this Agreement, which failure or refusal continues for a period of ten (10) days (or such longer period as the Commission, in its sole discretion, may determine if such failure is not capable of being cured within such ten (10) day period) after the date on which written notice thereof shall have been give to the Consultant by the Commission;
  - ii. Failure of Consultant to perform the Services to the standard of performance set forth in this Agreement:
    - iii. Any representation or warranty of the Consultant set forth herein or otherwise

delivered pursuant to this Agreement shall have been false in any material respect when so made or furnished;

- iv. The Consultant becomes insolvent or ceases doing business as a going concern, or makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or generally fails to pay, or admits in writing its inability to pay, its debts as they become due, or files a voluntary petition in bankruptcy, or is adjudicated a bankrupt or an insolvent, or files a petition seeking for itself any reorganization, arrangement, composition, readjustment, liquidation, dissolution, or similar arrangement under any present or future statute, law or regulation relating to bankruptcy or insolvency, or files an answer admitting the material allegations of a petition filed against it in any such proceeding, or applies for, consents to or acquiesces in the appointment of a trustee, receiver, liquidator or other custodian of it or of all or any substantial part of its assets or properties, or if it or its principals shall take any action in furtherance of any of the foregoing; or
- v. There shall be commenced any proceeding against the Consultant seeking reorganization, arrangement, readjustment, liquidation, dissolution or similar relief under any present or future statute, law or regulation relating to bankruptcy which is not vacated, stayed, discharged, bonded or dismissed within sixty (60) days thereof, or there shall be appointed, without the Consultant's consent or acquiescence, any trustee, receiver, liquidator or other custodian of Custodian or of all or any substantial part of the Consultant's otherwise dismissed within sixty (60) days thereof.
- b. Remedies. If an Event of Default shall occur and be continuing, then the Commission may exercise any right, power or remedy permitted to it by law or in equity and shall have, in particular, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the right to terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the Consultant, in which event the Commission shall have no further obligations hereunder or liability to the Consultant except as to payment for Services actually received and accepted by the Commission through the effective date of termination. No course of dealing on the part of the Commission or delay or failure on the part of the Commission to exercise any right shall operate as a waiver of such right or otherwise prejudice the Commission's rights, powers or remedies.
- c. Remedies not Exclusive. No right or remedy herein conferred upon or reserved to the Commission is exclusive of any right or remedy herein or by law or equity provided or permitted, but each shall be otherwise, and may be enforced concurrently therewith or from time to time.

### 11. <u>Disputes</u>.

- a. <u>General</u> All disputes arising under, related to or in connection with the terms of this Agreement or its interpretation, whether involving law or fact or both, including without limitation questions concerning permissibility of compensation, and all claims for alleged breach of contract, shall be presented in writing to the Executive Director for final determination.
- b. <u>Procedure.</u> Requests for determination of disputes will be made by the Consultant in writing specifically referencing this Section, and will include: 1) the issue(s) presented for resolution; 2) a statement of the respective positions of the Consultant and the Project Manager; 3) the facts underlying the dispute; 4) reference to the applicable provisions of the Agreement by page and section; 5) identify any other parties believed to be necessary to the resolution; and 6) all documentation which describes and relates to the dispute. Consultant will promptly provide the Executive Director with a copy of the request for determination of the dispute. The Project Manager will have thirty (30) business days to respond in writing to the dispute by supplementing the submission or providing its own submission to the Executive Director. Failure by the Project Manager to respond will not be deemed to be an admission of any

allegations made in the request for dispute resolution, but will be deemed to constitute a waiver of the opportunity to respond to such allegation(s), if any. The Executive Director's decision may thereafter be reached in accordance with such other information or assistance as she or he may deem reasonable, necessary or desirable.

c. <u>Effect.</u> The Executive Director's final decision will be rendered in writing no more than forty-five (45) business days after receipt of the response by the Project Manager was filed or was due unless the Executive Director notifies the Consultant that additional time for the decision is necessary. The Executive Director's decision will be conclusive, final, and binding on all parties. Consultant must follow the procedures set out in this Section and receive the Executive Director's final decision as a condition precedent to filing a complaint in the Circuit Court of Cook County or any other court.

The Consultant will not withhold performance of any Services required by the Commission under this Agreement during the dispute resolution period. The Executive Director's written determination will be complied with pending final resolution of the dispute.

- 12. <u>Confidentiality.</u> All of the reports, information, or data prepared or assembled by the Consultant under this Agreement are confidential, and the Consultant agrees that such reports, information or data shall not be made available to any party without the prior written approval of the Commission. In addition, the Consultant shall not, without the prior written consent of the Commission, prepare or distribute any news releases, articles, brochures, advertisements or other materials concerning this Agreement, the Project or the Services.
- Assignment. The Consultant acknowledges that the Commission is induced to enter into this Agreement by the personal qualifications of the principals, staff and employees of the Consultant and agrees, therefore, that neither this Agreement nor any right or obligation hereunder may be assigned by the Consultant, in whole or in part, without the prior written approval of the Commission. The Public Building Commission (PBC) has prepared this scope of work for performing a Phase II Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) at the above stated subject property.

This proposal is based on the information provided in the following:

- Phase I ESA Report prepared by K-Plus Environmental LLC, dated February 7, 2005;

Comprehensive Site Investigation Report prepared by K-Plus Environmental LLC, dated March 20, 2006;

- Information contained in the School Site Data conducted by Pioneer Engineering & Environmental Services, Inc. prepared on September 19, 2007;
- Phase I ESA prepared by K- Plus Environmental LLC, dated June 9, 2008 (revised July 31, 2008);
- Chicago Department of the Environment (CDOE) Underground Storage Tank (UST) records.

The Phase I ESA Report (2005) contained the following findings in connection with the subject property:

- Based on the Sanborn and Topographic maps, buildings 2, 3, and 4 were constructed for Chicago
  Tube and Iron on vacant land between 1950 and 1963. Buildings 2 and 3 are adjoining and were
  used for steel tubing warehousing and distribution. Building 4 houses a cutting center and
  maintenance operations for Chicago Tube and Iron.
- Suspect abandoned-in-place UST in Building 4
- Historical chemical storage and use in Building 4
- Existing diesel fuel UST in Building 2.

The Comprehensive Site Investigation Report (2006) contained the following findings in connection with the subject property:

- Existing diesel fuel UST at Building 2; a soil sample from boring K01 indicated benzo(a)pyrene, above Illinois EPA residential Tiered Approach to Corrective Action Objectives (TACO) Tier 1 soil remediation objectives (SROs).
- UST abandoned in place at Building 4; boring K29 omitted a slight petroleum odor during field work, but none of the soil samples collected and analyzed from borings K27, K28, K29 and K30 were found to be above residential SROs.

The Phase I ESA Report (2008) contained the following findings in connection with the subject property:

• Three former tanks and one current UST located at Building 2, and

Historical chemical storage and use related to maintenance and cutting operations at Building 4.
 Suspect abandoned-in-place UST in Building 4

#### Tasks

The Phase II ESA shall include the following tasks:

Task 1 - Geophysical Survey

Task 2 - Test-Pit Investigation

Task 3 - Underground Storage Tank Removal

Task 4 - Additional Subsurface Investigation

The following paragraphs provide detailed descriptions of the tasks:

# Task 1--Geophysical Survey

A geophysical survey will be performed for all accessible areas of the property. An approximate 5-foot grid pattern should be followed within the boundaries of the site and if any areas are inaccessible, these should be noted and documented in the report for the investigation. The purpose of the geophysical survey is to determine the potential presence of metallic objects such as underground storage tanks (USTs) or other underground structures at the subject property.

# Task 2 - Test-Pit Investigation

Following the geophysical survey, and if anomalies were identified in Task 1, this task will include trench excavations to identify and document the location of any potential anomalies which may indicate the presence of the historical tanks. If tank(s) are identified, the contractor will define the location and sizes of identified tanks and visually observe them in an effort to determine if they are intact.

# Task 3 – Underground Storage Tank Removal

If underground storage tanks are located during Task 2, a UST removal permit shall be obtained from the City of Chicago. After the UST removal permit is approved, the tank(s) must be removed in accordance with all applicable federal, state and city codes and regulations. Assume a 1,000 gallon tank removal for the purposes of this proposal.

One sample should be collected from the area of the excavation where a release may have most likely occurred (any visible stains and/or odors), with the sample analyzed for the contaminants of concern for the tank per Illinois EPA LUST regulations.

If there is no evidence of a release, no wall or floor samples need be collected and no further sampling should be conducted.

### Task 4 - Additional Subsurface Investigation

The objective of the Phase II ESA is to characterize the site subsurface soil condition and to determine the surface and subsurface soil has been impacted above applicable SROs. The Phase II ESA will be performed in accordance with the requirements of the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA), Title 35: Environmental Protection, Subtitle G: Waste Disposal, Chapter I: Pollution Control Boards, Part 740, Site Remediation Program (SRP). More specifically, the following tasks shall be performed:

- Advance twenty seven (27) soil borings at the site using a drill rig that is equipped to perform direct-push (commonly referred to as "Geoprobe"®). The borings will be extended to depths ranging between 12 and 16 feet below existing grade. The soil probes will be located in the vicinity of areas with soils above TACO Tier 1 SROs, based on the information provided in the School Site Data performed by Pioneer Engineering & Environmental Services, Inc. (September 2007), and based on historical data. Soil borings and associated analyses shall be as follows:
- 1. GP 1 Analyze for polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PNAs), Lead, Arsenic, Mercury, and Chromium
- 2. GP 2 Analyze for PNAs
- 3. GP 3 Analyze for PNAs, Arsenic, Mercury, Lead and Chromium
- 4. GP 4 Analyze for PNAs benzene, toluene, ethylbenzene and total xylenes (BTEX), MTBE (only around former diesel or gasoline tank)
- 5. GP 5 Analyze for PNAs, Arsenic, Mercury, Lead and Chromium
- 6. GP 6 Analyze for PNAs
- 7. GP 7 Analyze for PNAs, and RCRA metals
- 8. GP 8, 9, 10 Analyze for BTEX and PNAs

The three (3) soil borings (GP 8, 9, 10) should be placed around the perimeter (approximately 10 feet) of the diesel fuel tank located at the NE corner of building 2/3.

9. GP 11, 12, 13, 14 - Analyze for LUST pollutants

The four (4) soil borings should be placed along the perimeter (approximately 10 feet) of the suspected abandoned tank located along the north center of building 4.

- 10. GP 15, 16, 17, 18 Analyze four (4) soil samples for TCL, including Lead, Arsenic, Mercury, and Chromium
- 11. GP 19, 20, 21, 22 Analyze for PNAs, Lead, Arsenic, Mercury, and Chromium

- 12. GP 23 Analyze for PNAs, Lead, Arsenic, Mercury, and Chromium
- 13. GP 24 Analyze for PNAs, Lead, Arsenic, Mercury, and Chromium
- 14. GP 25 Analyze for PNAs, Lead, Arsenic, Mercury, and Chromium
- 15. GP 26 Analyze for TCL
- 16. GP 27 Analyze for BTEX, MTBE (around former gasoline tanks, based on CDOE records)

**Note:** Each boring (GP) will have three samples collected (unless groundwater is encountered), and analyzed for the specified analysis, as noted above.

- There are 18 borings to be analyzed for PNAs; i.e., 54 samples (18X3) will be submitted for analytical results.
- Two (2) borings require MTBE analysis; i.e., 6 samples to be submitted for laboratory results
- o 10 soil borings require metal analysis; i.e., 30 samples to be submitted for analysis
- o 5 soil borings require BTEX analysis; i.e., 15 samples submitted for analysis
- Evaluate soil samples collected from each boring for the presence of color, texture, consistency, and stains and/or odors on the boring logs.
- Decontaminate the field sampling equipment between each sample and drilling location to avoid cross-contamination of subsurface soil and samples.
- Collect three (3) soil samples from each boring at the site. One soil sample shall be collected at 0-3 feet, one sample should be collected at the point where the highest PID reading is recorded, and a third sample should be collected at a depth below the highest PID reading, but not below groundwater table. No soil sample will be collected below the groundwater table. The soil boring holes will be back-filled with soil cuttings and bentonite pellets, and finish with concrete or asphalt as applicable.
- Advance two soil borings at 15 feet and collect two (2) subsurface samples for geophysical analysis. This will include hydraulic conductivity, soil bulk density, porosity, soil particle density, fractional organic carbon content (foc) and moisture content.
- Collect two (2) subsurface composite samples from the site for waste characterization analysis.
   One of the composite samples should be from the vicinity of boring B-221, which had a historical lead analytical soil sample result of 2,700 ppm.
- Review and compare the analytical data to the IEPA Tiered Approach to Corrective Action Objectives (TACO) Tier 1 SROs for residential and construction worker limits.

The soil samples analytical results will be compared to the most stringent Tier 1 SROs for the inhalation,

ingestion, and soil component of the groundwater exposure route for residential and construction worker scenarios.

- Letter Report for Geophysical Survey. This report will serve as the basis for identifying locations for test pit investigations. The letter report shall identify the location(s) and the nature of any anomalies detected at the site. The consultant shall prepare a report with high resolution maps identifying the location and nature of the anomalies detected. The letter report shall consist of a two page summary of the work that includes the name of the personnel conducting the investigation, consultant firm name and address, site name, address and street or alley boundaries of the site, equipment used, time and date of study, background of the site, limitations of the investigations, results of the study, recommendations. The report shall include site photographs of each anomaly in color, type of equipment utilized for the GPR, clear map of the site location showing the site boundaries on the perimeter and a north arrow and GPS points for each anomaly. Two copies of this report are expected in hard copy and one in electronic format. One draft report shall be sent to the PBC PM and the CPS representative for review and comment. Two hard copies of the report and one electronic CD copy are an expected deliverable.
- Letter Report for Test Pit Investigation. If the geophysical survey identifies anomalies and test pit investigations are conducted, a letter report shall be prepared. The report shall provide a description of field activities conducted, CADD drawings with locations of anomalies and test pits, and color photos of any subsurface structures discovered during the test pit investigations, including any evidence of staining, as appropriate. The letter report shall include at a minimum: the name of the personnel conducting the investigation, consultant firm name and address, site name, address and street or alley boundaries of the site, equipment used, time and date of study, background of the site, limitations of the investigations, results of the study, recommendations. One draft report shall be sent to the PBC PM and the CPS representative for review and comment. Two hard copies of the report and one electronic CD copy are an expected deliverable.
- Report to Document UST Removal(s). If USTs are located and removed, a report shall be prepared in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and city requirements to document UST removal activities. The report shall provide a CADD drawing indicating the location and shall include analytical results of all soil samples obtained from UST excavations, and shall comply with the requirements of the Illinois EPA LUST program and regulations. One draft report shall be sent to the PBC PM and the CPS representative for review and comment. Two hard copies of the report and one electronic CD copy are an expected deliverable.
- Prepare a draft Phase II ESA report for the site in electronic form, and submit for review by PBC-PM and the Chicago Public Schools (CPS). The report shall identify all of the recognized environmental conditions and all of the related compounds of concern that were detected at the site. ### D.1. INSURANCE TO BE PROVIDED

# D.1.1. Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability

Workers' Compensation Insurance, as prescribed by applicable law covering all employees who are to provide a service under the Agreement and Employers Liability coverage with limits of not less than \$500,000 each accident, Illness or disease.

# D.1.2. Commercial General Liability (Primary and Umbrella)

Subcontractors performing work for Consultant must maintain limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence with the same terms herein

### D.1.5 Property

The Consultant is responsible for all loss or damage to Commission, Board and/or City of Chicago property at full replacement or repair cost. The Consultant is responsible for all loss or damage to personal property

(including but not limited to materials, equipment, tools, and supplies) owned, rented, or used by Consultant.

### D.1.6 Valuable Papers

When any plans, designs, drawings, specifications, data, media, and documents are produced or used under this Agreement, Valuable Papers Insurance shall be maintained in an amount to insure against any loss whatsoever, and shall have limits sufficient to pay for the re-creation and reconstruction of such records.

### D.1.7 Contractors Pollution Liability

When any work is performed which may cause a pollution exposure, Contractors Pollution Liability must be provided covering bodily injury, property damage and other losses caused by pollution conditions that arise from the Contract scope of services with limits of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence. Coverage must include completed operations, contractual liability, defense, excavation, environmental cleanup, remediation and disposal. When policies are renewed or replaced, the policy retroactive date must coincide with or precede, start of work on the Contract. A claims-made policy, which is not renewed or replaced, must have an extended reporting period of two (2) years. The Public Building Commission, Board of Education of the City of Chicago and the City of Chicago are to be named as additional insureds on a primary, non-contributory basis.

### D.1.8 Railroad Protective Liability

When any work is to be done adjacent to or on railroad or transit property, Contractor must provide, with respect to the operations that Contractor or subcontractors perform, Railroad Protective Liability Insurance in the name of railroad or transit entity. The policy must have limits of not less than the requirement of the operating railroad/transit entity for losses arising out of injuries to or death of all persons, and for damage to or destruction of property, including the loss of use thereof.

### D.2. ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

The Consultant must furnish the Public Building Commission Procurement Department, Richard J. Daley Center, Room 200, Chicago, IL 60602, original Certificates of Insurance, or such similar evidence, to be in force on the date of this Agreement, and Renewal Certificates of Insurance, or such similar evidence, if any insurance coverage has an expiration or renewal date occurring during the term of this Agreement. The Consultant must submit evidence of insurance to the Commission before award of Agreement. The receipt of any certificate does not constitute agreement by the Commission that the insurance requirements in the Agreement have been fully met or that the insurance policies indicated on the certificate are in compliance with all Agreement requirements. The failure of the Commission to obtain certificates or other insurance evidence from Consultant is not a waiver by the Commission of any requirements for the Consultant to obtain and maintain the specified coverage. The Consultant will advise all insurers of the Agreement provisions regarding insurance. Non-conforming insurance does not relieve Consultant of the obligation to provide insurance as specified in this Agreement. Nonfulfillment of the insurance conditions may constitute a breach of the Agreement, and the Commission retains the right to stop work until proper

evidence of insurance is provided, or the Agreement may be terminated.

The Commission reserves the right to obtain copies of insurance policies and records from the Consultant and/or its subcontractors at any time upon written request.

The insurance must provide for 30 days prior written notice to be given to the Commission if any policies are canceled, substantially changes, or non-renewed.

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions on referenced insurance must be borne by Consultant.

**Except for Professional Liability insurance**, the Consultant hereby waives and agrees to require their insurers to waive their rights of subrogation against the Commission, Board of Education of the City of Chicago and City of Chicago, their respective Board members, employees, elected and appointed officials, and representatives.

The insurance coverage and limits furnished by Consultant in no way limit the Consultant's liabilities and responsibilities specified within the Agreement or by law.

Any insurance or self-insurance programs maintained by the Commission, Board of Education of the City of Chicago and the City of Chicago do not contribute with insurance provided by the Consultant under the Agreement.

The required insurance to be carried is not limited by any limitations expressed in the indemnification language in this Agreement or any limitation placed on the indemnity in the Agreement given as a matter of law.

If Consultant is a joint venture or limited liability company, the insurance policies must name the joint venture or limited liability company as a named insured

The Consultant must require all its subcontractors to provide the insurance required in this Agreement, or Consultant may provide the coverage for its subcontractors. All subcontractors are subject to the same insurance requirements of Consultant unless otherwise specified in this Agreement.

If Consultant or its subcontractors desire additional coverage, the party desiring the additional coverage is responsible for the acquisition and cost.

The Commission's Risk Management Department maintains the rights to modify, delete, alter or change these requirements.
