THIS AGREEMENT effective as of July 1, 2009, but actually executed on the date witnessed, is entered into by and between the Public Building Commission of Chicago, a municipal corporation of the State of Illinois, having its principal office at Room 200, Richard J. Daley Center, 50 West Washington Street, Chicago, Illinois 60602, (the "Commission"), and GSG Consultants, Inc. with offices at 855 West Adams Street, Suite 200, Chicago, Illinois (the "Consultant").

Background Information - Recitals:

Whereas, The Commission on behalf of the Chicago Public Library (referred to in this Agreement as the "User Agency"), intends to undertake the construction and/or improvement of the following facility or facilities in Chicago, Illinois described in Schedule A attached to the Agreement (the "Project"):

Whereas, the Commission requires certain professional services described in the Agreement, in connection with the Project and desires to retain the Consultant on the terms and conditions set forth in the Agreement to perform such Services. The Consultant desires to be so retained by the Commission and has represented to the Commission that the Consultant has the knowledge, skill, experience and other resources necessary to perform the Services in the manner provided by the Agreement.

Whereas, the Consultant has consulted with the Commission and the User Agency, made site inspections, and taken such other actions as the Consultant deemed necessary or advisable to make itself fully acquainted with the scope and requirements of the Project and the Services. The Consultant represents that it is qualified and competent by education, training and experience to prepare drawings, specifications and construction documents necessary to complete the Project in accordance with standards of reasonable professional skill and diligence.

Whereas, the Commission has relied upon the Consultant's representations in selecting the Consultant.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties agree on the terms and conditions that follow:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS - ENVIRONMENTAL CONSULTING

- 1. <u>Definitions.</u> The following phrases have the same meanings for purposes of this Agreement.
- Agreement means this professional services agreement for environmental consulting services, including all exhibits or documents attached hereto and/or incorporated by reference herein, and all amendments, modifications, or revisions made in accordance with the terms hereof.
- Commission as herein referred to shall include the Public Building Commission of Chicago, the Commission's Chairman, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, Executive Director, Director of Construction, Managing Architect, Project Manager, or designated consultant or consultants, acting on behalf thereof, as designated by the Commission in writing, for the purpose of giving authorizations, instructions, and/or approval pursuant to this Agreement.
- Contract Documents consists of all of the component parts of the Contract between the Commission and the General Contractor for the construction and improvement of the Project including, without limitation, the general and special conditions, technical specifications, drawings, addenda, bulletins and modifications thereto.
- Consultant means the company or other entity identified in this Agreement, and such successors or assigns, if any, as may be authorized by the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- Key Personnel means those job titles and persons as identified in those positions as identified in Consultant's proposal and accepted by the Commission.
- Project means the construction and/or improvement of the facility or facilities specified in this Agreement.
- Services means, collectively, the services, duties and responsibilities that are necessary to allow the Consultant to provide the Services required by the Commission under this agreement.
- Sub-consultant means a firm hired by the Consultant to perform professional services related to the construction and/or improvement of the Project.
- Technical Personnel as herein referred to include partners, officers and all other personnel of the Consultant, including technical typists assigned to the Project, exclusive of general office employees.
- User Agency means the municipal corporation that requested the Commission to undertake the construction and/or improvement of the Project.
- Incorporation of Documents. The documents identified below in this paragraph are hereby incorporated in and made a part of this Agreement. By executing this Agreement, Consultant acknowledges and agrees that Consultant is familiar with the contents of each of such documents and will comply fully with all applicable portions thereof in performing the Services.
- Project Documents. The plans and specifications for the Project, to the extent that plans and specifications for the Project have been prepared, as set forth and described in this Agreement (the "Project Documents").
- Policies Concerning MBE and WBE. The Commission's policies concerning utilization of minority business enterprises ("MBE") and women business enterprises ("WBE"), as the same may be revised from time to time.
 - 3. Engagement and Standards for Performing Services.
- Engagement. The Commission hereby engages the Consultant, and the Consultant hereby accepts such engagement, to provide the Services described in this agreement, as the same may be amended, in writing, from time to time by mutual agreement of the Commission and the Consultant.
- Performance Standard. The Consultant represents and agrees that the Services performed under this Agreement will proceed with efficiency, promptness and diligence and will be executed in a competent and thorough manner, in accordance with reasonable professional standards in the field consistent with that degree of skill and care ordinarily exercised by practicing environmental consulting professionals performing services of a scope, purpose, and magnitude comparable with the Services to be provided under this Agreement. If in the course of performing the Services, Consultant identifies any environmental condition, situation, issue or problem that may impact the performance of the Services or the Project, Consultant shall promptly provide notice to the Commission. The Consultant further promises that it will assign at all times during the term of the Agreement the number of experienced, appropriately trained employees necessary for the

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Consultant to perform the Services in the manner required by the Agreement.

In as much as Consultant will be performing design services, Consultant acknowledges and agrees that Consultant is liable for any and all of its errors and omissions that may be found in the construction documents that are issued to bid for the construction of the Project.

- Consultant's Personnel. Consultant must ensure that all Services that require the exercise of professional skills or judgment are accomplished by professionals qualified and competent in the applicable discipline and appropriately licensed, if required by law. Consultant must maintain current copies of any such licenses and provide these copies upon request by the Commission. Consultant remains responsible for the professional and technical accuracy of all Services furnished, whether by the Consultant or others on its behalf. All deliverables will be prepared in a form and content satisfactory to the Commission and delivered in a timely manner consistent with the requirements of the Agreement.
- Confidentiality. Consultant acknowledges that it is entrusted with or has access to valuable and confidential information and records of the Commission and User Agency. Consultant must at all times use it best efforts on behalf of the Commission to assure timely and satisfactory rendering and completion of its Services. Consultant must at all times act in the best interests of the Commission and User Agency consistent with Consultant's professional obligations assumed by Consultant in entering into this Agreement. Consultant promises to cooperate with the officials, employees and agents of the Commission and User Agency in furthering the Commission's and User Agency's interests. Consultant must perform all Services in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, to the reasonable satisfaction of the Commission.
- Independent Contractor. In performing the Services under this Agreement, Consultant shall at all times be an independent contractor, and does not and must not act or represent itself as an agent or employee of the Commission or the User Agency. As an independent contractor, Consultant is solely and wholly responsible for determining the means and methods for performing the Services. The Agreement will not be construed as an agreement of partnership, joint venture, or agency.
- Limitations on Sub-Consultants. Consultant must not use any business or individual who is disqualified by the Commission or debarred under any other governmental agency's procedures to provide the Services under the Agreement.
- Failure to Meet Performance Standard. If the Consultant fails to comply with its obligations under the standards of the Agreement, the Consultant must perform again, at its own expense, all Services required to be re-performed as a direct or indirect result of that failure. Any review, approval, acceptance or payment for any of the Services by the Commission does not relieve Consultant of its responsibility to render the Services and deliverables with the professional skill and care and technical accuracy required by the Agreement. This provision in no way limits the Commission's rights against the Consultant, either under the Agreement, at law or in equity.
- Changes to the Services. The Commission may from time to time, request changes to the terms of the Agreement or in the Scope of Services of the Consultant to be performed hereunder. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of compensation and revisions to the duration of the Services, which are mutually agreed upon by and between the Commission and Consultant, shall be incorporated in a written amendment to this Agreement. The Commission shall not be liable for any changes absent such written amendment.

Duties and Obligations of Consultant

- Nondiscrimination. The Consultant agrees that in performing this Agreement it shall not discriminate against any worker, employee or applicant for employment, or any member of the public, because of race, creed, gender, color, national origin or disability, or otherwise commit an unfair labor practice. Attention is called to applicable provisions of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 88-352, July 2, 1964, 78 Stat. 241 et. Seq. the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. 12010 et. Seq. the Illinois Human Rights Act 775 ILCS 5/1-101 et. Seq. and the Public Works Employment Discrimination Act 775 ILCS 10/0.0 1 through 10/20, inclusive and a Resolution passed by the Board of Commissioners of the Public Building Commission of Chicago on October 1, 2004, concerning participation of Minority Business Enterprises and Women Business Enterprises on contracts awarded by the Commission. The Consultant will furnish such reports and information as requested by the Commission and the Illinois Department of Human Relations or any other administrative or governmental entity overseeing the enforcement, administration or compliance with the above referenced laws and regulations.
- Employment Procedures, Preferences and Compliances. Salaries of employees of Consultant performing work under this Agreement shall be paid unconditionally and not less often than once a month without deduction or rebate on any account except only such payroll deductions as are mandatory or permitted by the applicable law or regulations. Attention is called to Illinois Compiled Statutes, 1992 relating to Wages and Hours including 820 ILCS 130/0.01 through 130/12

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thereof (Prevailing Wage Act), 30 ILCS 570/1 through 570/7 (Employment of Illinois Workers on Public Works Act) and 30 ILCS 560/0.01 through 560/7 (Public Works Preference Act). The Consultant shall comply with all applicable "Anti-Kickback" laws and regulations, including the "Anti-Kickback" Act of June 13, 1934 (48 Stat. 948; 62 Stat. 740; 63 Stat. 108; 18 U.S.C. § 874; 40 U.S.C. § 276c) and the Illinois Criminal Code of 1961 720 ILCS 5/33E-1 et. seq. If, in the performance of this Agreement, there is any direct or indirect kickback, the Commission shall withhold from the Consultant, out of payments due to it, an amount sufficient to pay employees underpaid the difference between the salaries required hereby to be paid and the salaries actually paid such employees for the total number of hours worked. The amounts withheld shall be disbursed by the Commission for and on account of the Consultant to the respective employees to whom they are due.

- c. <u>Compliance with Policies Concerning MBE and WBE.</u> Without limiting the generality of the requirements of the policies of the Commission referred to in paragraph 2 above, the Consultant agrees to use best efforts to utilize minority business enterprises for not less than twenty five percent (25%) for MBE and five percent (5%) for WBE of the value of the Services, in accordance with the Resolution passed by the Board of Commissioners of the Commission on October 1, 2004, concerning participation of minority business enterprises and women business enterprises on contracts awarded by the Commission and to furnish to the Commission, such reports and other information concerning compliance with such Resolution as may be requested by the Commission from time to time.
- d. <u>Delays.</u> The Consultant agrees that no charges for damages or claims for damages shall be asserted by it against the Commission for any delays or hindrances from any cause whatsoever during the progress of any portion of the Services. Such delays or hindrances, if any, shall be compensated for by an extension of time to complete the Services, for such reasonable period as may be mutually agreed upon between the parties, it being understood, however, that the agreement of the Commission to allow the Consultant to complete the Services or any part of them after the time provided for the completion thereof herein shall in no way operate as a waiver on the part of the Commission of any of its rights hereunder.
- e. Records. The Consultant shall maintain accurate and complete records of expenditures, costs and time incurred by Consultant in connection with the Project and the Services. Such records shall be maintained in accordance with recognized commercial accounting practices. The Commission may examine such records at Consultant's offices upon reasonable notice during normal business hours. Consultant shall retain all such records for a period of not less than five calendar years after the termination of this Agreement.
- f. <u>Time of Essence.</u> The Consultant acknowledges and agrees that time is of the essence in the performance of this Agreement and that timely completion of the Services is vital to the completion of the Project by the Commission. Consultant agrees to use its best efforts to expedite performance of the Services and performance of all other obligations of the Consultant under this Agreement and any other agreements entered into by the Commission which are managed or administered by the Consultant as a result of the Consultant's engagement hereunder.
- g. <u>Compliance with Laws.</u> In performing its engagement under this Agreement, the Consultant shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, including but not limited to, those referenced in subparagraphs (a) and (b) above and in the documents referred to in paragraph 2 of this Agreement.
- h. <u>Progress Meetings.</u> Meetings to discuss the progress of the Project and/or to review the performance of the Consultant may be scheduled upon the Commission's request, at mutually agreeable times and locations, and the Consultant agrees to cause such meetings to be attended by appropriate personnel of the Consultant engaged in performing or knowledgeable of the Services.
- i. <u>Defects in Project.</u> The Consultant shall notify the Commission immediately in the event the Consultant obtains knowledge of a defect in the Project or circumstances which could result in a Project delay or cost overrun.

5. <u>Term.</u>

- a. The term of this Agreement shall begin upon the final execution of this Agreement, and, subject to the provisions of subparagraph (b) below, shall expire upon completion of the Services and acceptance thereof by the Commission or, if the Services are of an ongoing nature, on the completion date specified in such Request for Services. The Commission and the Consultant may, from time to time, by mutual agreement, extend the term of this Agreement by amending this Agreement.
- b. The Commission shall have the right, at any time, to terminate the term of this Agreement, with or without cause, by written notice given to the Consultant at least thirty (30) days prior to the effective date of termination. In

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addition, the Commission shall have the right, at any time and from time to time, with or without cause, to suspend the performance of the Consultant's services hereunder with respect to all or any part of the Services, by written notice given to the Consultant at least five (5) days prior to the effective date of suspension. Termination or suspension of this Agreement shall not relieve the Consultant from liability for the performance of any obligation of the Consultant under this Agreement performed or to have been performed by the Consultant on or before the effective date of termination or suspension. Provided the Consultant is not in default under this Agreement at the time of termination or suspension, the Commission agrees to pay to the Consultant, in accordance with the terms of this Agreement, all compensation and reimbursements due to the Consultant for periods up to the effective date of termination or suspension. In no event shall the Commission be liable to the Consultant for any loss, cost or damage which the Consultant or any other party may sustain by reason of the Commission terminating or suspending this Agreement as provided herein; provided, however, that the Commission may, in its sole discretion, reimburse the Consultant for actual expenses approved by the Commission.

- c. If the Project, in whole or substantial part, is stopped for a period longer than thirty (30) days under an order of any court or other governmental authority having jurisdiction of the Project, or as a result of an act of government, such as a declaration of national emergency making materials unavailable, through no act or fault of the Consultant, or if the Commission fails to make any payment or perform any other obligation hereunder, the Consultant shall have the right to terminate this agreement, by written notice given to the Commission at least seven (7) days prior to the effective date of termination, and shall have the right to recover from the Commission all compensation and reimbursements due to the Consultant for periods up to the effective date of termination.
- 6. <u>Compensation of Consultant: Reimbursement for Expenses.</u> The Commission shall compensate the Consultant for the Services in the manner set forth Schedule C of this Agreement. In addition, the Commission shall, upon submission of detailed invoices by the Consultant, no more frequently than once every 30 days, and approval by the Commission of those invoices, reimburse the Consultant for all Reimbursable Expenses. As used in this paragraph, the term "Reimbursable Expenses" shall mean those expenses identified as such in this Agreement.
- 7. <u>Rights and Obligations of Commission.</u> In connection with the administration of the Project by the Commission and the performance of this Agreement by the Consultant, the Commission shall have the following rights and obligations, in addition to those provided elsewhere in this Agreement:
- a. <u>Information.</u> The Commission shall provide the Consultant all reasonably requested information concerning the Commission's requirements for the Project and the Services.
- b. <u>Review of Documents.</u> Subject to the provisions of subparagraph 4 (d) above, the Commission agrees to make a reasonable effort to examine documents submitted by the Consultant and render decisions pertaining thereto with reasonable promptness.
- c. <u>Site Data.</u> To the extent the Commission determines to be necessary for the Consultant to perform the Services, the Commission may furnish, or may authorize the Consultant to obtain from a company or companies approved by the Commission as Reimbursable Expenses: (i) a certified survey of the site or sites; (ii) information concerning locations, dimensions and data pertaining to existing buildings and other improvements; (iii) title information; (iv) information concerning available service and utility lines; and (v) results of test borings and other information concerning subsoil conditions.
- d. <u>Tests and Reports.</u> To the extent required for the Consultant to perform the Services, the Commission may furnish structural, civil, chemical, mechanical, soil mechanical and/or other tests and reports; however, the Commission may authorize the Consultant to procure such tests and reports from Sub-Consultants, which must be approved by the Commission. The costs of such Sub-Consultants shall be payable as Reimbursable Expenses.
- e. <u>Legal, Auditing and other Services.</u> The Commission shall arrange and pay for such legal, auditing, insurance counseling and other services as the Commission, in its sole discretion, may determine to be required for the Project. Such payments shall not include legal or auditing expenses arising out of or relating to any errors or omissions, or claimed errors or omissions, of Consultant.
- f. <u>Designated Representatives.</u> The Commission may designate, at its sole discretion, one or more representatives authorized to act in its behalf.
- g. Ownership of Documents. All documents, data, studies and reports prepared by the Consultant or any party engaged by the Consultant, pertaining to the Project and/or the Services shall be the property of the Commission including copyrights.

- h. <u>Audits.</u> The Commission shall have the right to audit the books of the Consultant on all subjects relating to the Project and/or the Services.
- 8. <u>Indemnification of Commission.</u> The Consultant hereby agrees to indemnify, keep and save hamless the Commission and the User Agency and their respective commissioners, board members, officers, agents, officials and employees from and against all claims, demands, suits, losses, costs and expenses, including but not limited to, the fees and expenses of attorneys, that may arise out of or be based on any injury to persons or property that is or is claimed to be the result of an error, omission or act of the Consultant or any person employed by the Consultant to the maximum extent permitted by applicable law.
- 9. <u>Insurance to be Maintained by Consultant.</u> The Consultant shall purchase and maintain at all times during the performance of Services hereunder, for the benefit of the Commission, the User Agency and the Consultant, insurance coverage as set forth in Schedule D of this agreement

10. Default.

- a. <u>Events of Default.</u> Any one or more of the following occurrences shall constitute an Event of Default under this Agreement:
 - i. Failure or refusal on the part of the Consultant duly to observe or perform any obligation or agreement on the part of the Consultant contained in this Agreement, which failure or refusal continues for a period of ten (10) days (or such longer period as the Commission, in its sole discretion, may determine if such failure is not capable of being cured within such ten (10) day period) after the date on which written notice thereof shall have been give to the Consultant by the Commission;
 - ii. Failure of Consultant to perform the Services to the standard of performance set forth in this Agreement;
 - iii. Any representation or warranty of the Consultant set forth herein or otherwise delivered pursuant to this Agreement shall have been false in any material respect when so made or furnished;
 - iv. The Consultant becomes insolvent or ceases doing business as a going concern, or makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors, or generally fails to pay, or admits in writing its inability to pay, its debts as they become due, or files a voluntary petition in bankruptcy, or is adjudicated a bankrupt or an insolvent, or files a petition seeking for itself any reorganization, arrangement, composition, readjustment, liquidation, dissolution, or similar arrangement under any present or future statute, law or regulation relating to bankruptcy or insolvency, or files an answer admitting the material allegations of a petition filed against it in any such proceeding, or applies for, consents to or acquiesces in the appointment of a trustee, receiver, liquidator or other custodian of it or of all or any substantial part of its assets or properties, or if it or its principals shall take any action in furtherance of any of the foregoing; or
 - v. There shall be commenced any proceeding against the Consultant seeking reorganization, arrangement, readjustment, liquidation, dissolution or similar relief under any present or future statute, law or regulation relating to bankruptcy which is not vacated, stayed, discharged, bonded or dismissed within sixty (60) days thereof, or there shall be appointed, without the Consultant's consent or acquiescence, any trustee, receiver, liquidator or other custodian of Custodian or of all or any substantial part of the Consultant's assets and properties, and such appointment shall not have been vacated, stayed, discharged, bonded or otherwise dismissed within sixty (60) days thereof.
- b. Remedies. If an Event of Default shall occur and be continuing, then the Commission may exercise any right, power or remedy permitted to it by law or in equity and shall have, in particular, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the right to terminate this Agreement upon written notice to the Consultant, in which event the Commission shall have no further obligations hereunder or liability to the Consultant except as to payment for Services actually received and accepted by the Commission through the effective date of termination. No course of dealing on the part of the Commission or delay or failure on the part of the Commission to exercise any right shall operate as a waiver of such right or otherwise prejudice the Commission's rights, powers or remedies.
- c. Remedies not Exclusive. No right or remedy herein conferred upon or reserved to the Commission is exclusive of any right or remedy herein or by law or equity provided or permitted, but each shall be cumulative of every other right or remedy given hereunder or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute or otherwise, and may be enforced concurrently therewith or from time to time.
 - Disputes.

- a. <u>General.</u> All disputes arising under, related to or in connection with the terms of this Agreement or its interpretation, whether involving law or fact or both, including without limitation questions concerning permissibility of compensation, and all claims for alleged breach of contract, shall be presented in writing to the Executive Director for final determination.
- b. <u>Procedure.</u> Requests for determination of disputes will be made by the Consultant in writing specifically referencing this Section, and will include: 1) the issue(s) presented for resolution; 2) a statement of the respective positions of the Consultant and the Project Manager; 3) the facts underlying the dispute; 4) reference to the applicable provisions of the Agreement by page and section; 5) identify any other parties believed to be necessary to the resolution; and 6) all documentation which describes and relates to the dispute. Consultant will promptly provide the Executive Director with a copy of the request for determination of the dispute. The Project Manager will have thirty (30) business days to respond in writing to the dispute by supplementing the submission or providing its own submission to the Executive Director. Failure by the Project Manager to respond will not be deemed to be an admission of any allegations made in the request for dispute resolution, but will be deemed to constitute a waiver of the opportunity to respond to such allegation(s), if any. The Executive Director's decision may thereafter be reached in accordance with such other information or assistance as she or he may deem reasonable, necessary or desirable.
- c. Effect. The Executive Director's final decision will be rendered in writing no more than forty-five (45) business days after receipt of the response by the Project Manager was filed or was due unless the Executive Director notifies the Consultant that additional time for the decision is necessary. The Executive Director's decision will be conclusive, final, and binding on all parties. Consultant must follow the procedures set out in this Section and receive the Executive Director's final decision as a condition precedent to filing a complaint in the Circuit Court of Cook County or any other court.

The Consultant will not withhold performance of any Services required by the Commission under this Agreement during the dispute resolution period. The Executive Director's written determination will be compiled with pending final resolution of the dispute.

- 12. <u>Confidentiality.</u> All of the reports, information, or data prepared or assembled by the Consultant under this Agreement are confidential, and the Consultant agrees that such reports, information or data shall not be made available to any party without the prior written approval of the Commission. In addition, the Consultant shall not, without the prior written consent of the Commission, prepare or distribute any news releases, articles, brochures, advertisements or other materials concerning this Agreement, the Project or the Services.
- 13. <u>Assignment.</u> The Consultant acknowledges that the Commission is induced to enter into this Agreement by the personal qualifications of the principals, staff and employees of the Consultant and agrees, therefore, that neither this Agreement nor any right or obligation hereunder may be assigned by the Consultant, in whole or in part, without the prior written approval of the Commission. The Commission expressly reserves the right to assign or otherwise transfer all or any part of its interests hereunder without the consent or approval of the Consultant.
- 14. <u>Personnel.</u> The Consultant further acknowledges that the Consultant has represented to the Commission the availability of certain members of the Consultant's staff who will be assigned to the Project, and agrees, therefore, that in the event of the unavailability of such members, the Consultant shall so notify the Commission in writing, and, upon the approval of the Executive Director, shall assign other qualified members of the Consultant's staff, to the Project.
- 15. Relationship of Parties. The relationship of the Consultant to the Commission hereunder is that of an independent contractor, and the Consultant, except to the extent expressly provided to the contrary in this agreement, shall have no right or authority to make contracts or commitments for or on behalf of the Commission, to sign or endorse on behalf of the Commission any instruments of any nature or to enter into any obligation binding upon the Commission. This Agreement shall not be construed as an agreement of partnership, joint venture, or agency.

16. Miscellaneous.

- a. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, any of which shall be deemed an original.
- b. <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding and agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous oral or written representations or communications with respect to the subject matter hereof, all of which communications are merged herein. This Agreement shall not be modified, amended or in any way altered except by an instrument in writing signed by both of the parties hereto.
- c. <u>Force Majeure.</u> Neither of the parties shall be liable to the other for any delay or failure in performance hereunder due to causes which are beyond the control of the party unable to perform. If a force majeure occurs, the party delayed or unable to perform shall give prompt notice to the other party, and the Commission may, at any time during the continuation of the force majeure event, elect to suspend the performance of the Consultant under this Agreement for the

duration of the force majeure. The Commission shall not be obligated to pay for Services to the extent and for the duration that performance thereof is delayed or prevented by force majeure, but, provided the Consultant is not in default of any obligation of the Consultant hereunder, the Commission shall pay to the Consultant, according to the terms hereof, all compensation and reimbursements due to the Consultant for periods up to the effective date of suspension.

- d. Governing Law. This Agreement has been negotiated and executed in the State of Illinois and shall be construed under and in accordance with the internal laws of the State of Illinois.
- e. <u>No Waiver</u>. The waiver by either party of any breach of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver as to any succeeding breach.
- f. Notices. All notices required to be given hereunder shall be given in writing and shall be hand delivered or sent by United States certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, addressed to Commission and to the Consultant at their respective addresses set forth above. If given as herein provided, such notice shall be deemed to have been given on the date of delivery, if delivered by hand, and on the second business day after mailing, if given by mail. The Commission or the Consultant may, from time to time, change the address to which notices hereunder shall be sent by giving notice to the other party in the manner provided in this subparagraph.
- g. <u>Reimbursable Expenses.</u> Reimbursable expenses includes those actual expenditures, as identified in Schedule C to this Agreement, which are made by the Consultant and payable by the Commission.
- h. <u>Severability.</u> In the event that any provisions of this Agreement shall be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.
- i. <u>Successors and Assigns.</u> Except as otherwise provided herein, this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of each of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.
- j. <u>Consultant's Authority.</u> Execution of this Agreement by the Consultant is authorized by a resolution of its Board of Directors, if a corporation, or similar governing document if a partnership or a joint venture, and the signatures(s) of each person signing on behalf of the Consultant have been made with complete and full authority to commit the Consultant to all terms and conditions of this Agreement, including each and every representation, certification and warranty contained or incorporated by reference in it.

SITE HISTORY

The proposed Daley Replacement Library (Subject property) includes the Daley Library, an approximately 14,100-square foot, single story building, an approximately 6,500-square foot outdoor plaza area and a three-story former Wendt furniture retailer (furniture building) located on approximately one acre of land. The Daley Library is currently an operational public library, and the furniture building is vacant.

Based on historical records research, occupants of the property included dwellings and multi-tenant commercial properties such as Drug Store, a "Furniture" business, two dry cleaners, Anna's Dollar, and the Daley Public Library. A dry cleaner was also located on adjacent property to the east across Halsted Avenue.

A Phase I Environmental Site Assessment of the Subject property was completed in May 2009, and identified the following Recognized Environmental Conditions (RECs):

CDOE documented the removal/installation of the following USTs at the Subject Property:

- Four USTs were installed at the Subject Property and one 2000-gallon UST and two 550-gallon USTs were removed from the Subject Property. There were no records indicating that the fourth (2,000-gallon UST) was removed, nor were records returned indicating that any confirmatory sampling was performed.
- Historic commercial occupants identified at the Subject Property through a review of historical Sanborn Fire Insurance maps, Freedom of Information requests and an EDR Environmental database included a business labeled as "Drugs" and several stores and dwellings in 1912, a Historical Cleaner site for laundry operations in 1928, a "Cleaner and Dyers" in 1976, a business labeled "Furniture" built in 1957, a businesses labeled "Library" and "Furniture" from approximately1988 to 1994, and Anna's Dollar in October 25, 2006. Industrial occupants were not identified at the Subject Property.
- An elevator was located on the west side of the furniture building. Because it could not be determined if the elevator
 was hydraulically operated or contained a hydraulic fluid reservoir, there is a potential for a potential spill or leak from
 the system.
- CDOE Freedom-of-Information records indicated that waste oil from drums located in the alley behind the 3410 S.
 Halsted property had been pumped into an aboveground storage tank (AST) located in the basement of the building through a metal intake pipe in the alley-side wall of the Subject Property. The CDOE records stated that the metal intake pipe was observed to have associated waste-oil staining.
- A Dry Cleaner was located on the adjacent topographically upgradient east property (3405 S. Halsted).

A copy of the Phase I ESA and Phase II ESA Scope of Works shall be provided to the consultant that is awarded this work.

TASK 1. ELECTROM AGNETIC SURVEY

Conduct an Electromagnetic Survey of open areas of the property to determine if underground tanks, drums or other similar recognized environmental conditions are present.

The Consultant shall prepare a letter report that contains a one to two page summary of the survey provided including the name of the personnel conducting the survey, Consultant firm name and address, sub-contractors name and address, site name, address and street or alley boundaries of the site, equipment used, time and date of study, background of the site, limitations of the survey, locations of anomalies identified, and site maps detailing the survey findings.

The Consultant shall provide two printed copies and one electronic copy (PDF and Word format) of a "Draft EM Survey Report" to the PBC for review and comment. The Consultant shall be prepared to conduct revisions to the document. The Consultant shall then provide one electronic copy (PDF format) of an "Interim Final EM Survey Report" – incorporating the comments on the "Draft EM Survey Report" - to the PBC for review and comment. The Consultant shall then provide three printed copies and three electronic copies (PDF format) of a "Final EM Survey Report" to the PBC.

TASK 2. TEST PITS

The Consultant shall prepare and submit to the PBC a "Health and Safety Plan" ten (10) working days prior to the start of work. Additionally, prior to the start of work, the Consultant shall contact DIGGER, the Chicago Utility Network 72 hours prior to beginning the fieldwork in order to mark the locations of underground utilities and obtain services of a utility locator to identify utilities on-site. The Consultant shall contact the PBC Project Manager and all utility companies for information regarding buried utilities and structures, shall take all reasonable precautions to prevent damage to property both visible and concealed.

The Consultant shall conduct test pits of anomalous areas where suspected underground tanks drums or other similar recognized environmental conditions may be present. (Assume 1 day of Test Pits).

Excavated test pit materials shall be backfilled into the test pit locations and compacted if no tanks are identified. If tank(s) are identified, the consultant will define the location and sizes of identified tanks and visually observe them in an effort to determine if they are intact. If tanks are identified, the PBC will remove the tanks under separate contract.

The Consultant shall prepare a letter report that contains a one to two page summary of the work provided including the name of the personnel conducting the investigation, Consultant firm name and address, sub-contractors name and address, site name, address and street or alley boundaries of the site, equipment used, time and date of study, background of the site, limitations of the investigations, locations of underground tanks and objects and/or subsurface structures encountered, and digital photographs documenting test pit activities.

The Consultant shall provide two printed copies and one electronic copy (PDF and Word format) of a "Draft Test Pit Investigation Report" to the PBC for review and comment. The Consultant shall be prepared to conduct revisions to the report. The Consultant shall then provide one electronic copy (PDF format) of an "Interim Final Test Pit Investigation Report" – incorporating the comments on the "Draft Test Pit Investigation Report" – to the PBC for review and comment. The Consultant shall then provide three printed copies and three electronic copies (PDF format) of a "Final Test Pit Investigation Report" to the PBC.

TASK 3 PHASE II ENVIRONMENTAL SITE ASSESSMENT (ESA)

PHASE II ESA OBJECTIVE

The objective of the Phase II ESA is to determine if historical underground tanks are still located on the property, to characterize the site subsurface soil condition and to determine if the recognized environmental conditions identified have resulted in the presence of contaminants of concern above applicable TACO Tier 1 Residential and Construction Worker SROs in surface or subsurface soil.

SCOPE OF WORK

The Purpose of the Phase II Environmental Site Assessment is to determine if the RECs identified at the site has resulted in the presence of contaminants of concern above TACO Tier I Residential Site Remediation Objectives or applicable TACO Listed background concentrations for Inorganic Chemicals and Polynuclear Aromatic hydrocarbons, the following scope of work is being requested;

The Consultant shall prepare and submit to the PBC a "Health and Safety Plan, ten (10) working days prior to the start of work. Additionally, prior to the start of work, the Consultant shall contact DIGGER, the Chicago Utility Network 72 hours prior to beginning the fieldwork in order to mark the locations of underground utilities and obtain services of a utility locator to identify utilities on-site.

The soil investigation will consist of the advancement of twelve (12)soil borings using direct-push technology (i.e., Geoprobe®) to approximate maximum depths of twenty (20) feet below ground surface (bgs) or until ground water is encountered, whichever is encountered first. More specifically, the soil probes will be located in the following areas (See Figure 1 – Soil Boring Location Map):

- Two (2) soil borings along the east side of the Daley Library building located at 3400 S. Halsted to address off-site dry cleaner related RECs.
- Two (2) soil borings along the north side of the Daley Library building located at 3400 S. Halsted to address former UST and dry cleaner related RECs.
- One (1) soil boring within the Daley library building located at 3400 S. Halsted. 3400 S. Halsted (access permitting) to address former UST and dry cleaner related RECs
- Three (3) soil borings within the parking area along the public alley on the west side of the Daley Library building located at 3400 S. Halsted to address former UST and dry cleaner related RECs
- One (1) soil boring near a vent pipe on the west side of the former furniture building located at 3410 S. Halsted to address UST and waste oil related RECs
- One (1) soil boring inside the interior loading dock area associated with the furniture building located at 3410 S.
 Halsted to address UST and waste oil related RECs.
- One (1) soil boring on the east side of the former furniture building located at 3410 S. Halsted, to address off-site dry cleaner related RECs.
- One soil boring in the vicinity of the elevator area inside the former furniture building located at 3410 S. Halsted to address hydraulic oil related RECs.
- One (1) PCB wipe sample from elevator's hydraulic system inside the former furniture building located at 3410 S.
 Halsted to address hydraulic oil related RECs.

Soil samples will be collected continuously until the termination depth of each soil probe. All soil boring samples shall be field screened for Volatile Organic Compounds using a Photoionization Detector (PID), and physically inspected for stains and odors. Each sample shall also visually examined and given an estimated classification using the Unified Soils Classification System (USCS).

Three soil samples shall be obtained from each soil boring location. At each soil boring location, the soil boring sample that exhibited the highest PID reading or evidence of stains or odors shall be collected and analyzed in accordance with the analytical testing scheme listed below. The remaining two samples shall be placed on hold until the results of the initial sample analysis has been received. On hold samples shall only be analyzed for those parameters that exceed TACO Tier I Residential and Construction Worker Site Remediation Objectives (SROs). At no time shall sample holding times be exceeded for any samples analyzed. If none of the detected parameters exceed TACO Tier 1 SROs, the samples collected below the sample that exhibited the highest PID reading/stains and odors shall not be analyzed. For the purpose of this Phase II Environmental Site Assessment, Tier 1 Residential and Construction Worker SROs shall include applicable TACO Listed Background Concentrations for lnorganic Chemicals and Polynuclear Aromatic Hydrocarbons where parameter background levels are higher than the TACO Tier 1 SROs

Analytical Testing Scheme 3400-3408 S. Halsted - Daley Library Property

For the two (2) soil borings along the east side of the Daley Library building, the sample that contained the highest PID reading

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or evidence of stains and odors shall be analyzed for VOCs. If PID readings are at or below background, the soil sample shall be collected based on field determinations. If the analytical results of the sample analyzed for VOCs contain detected levels of VOCs that exceed TACO Tier 1 SRO for Residential Properties and Construction Workers, the 0-3 foot samples shall only be analyzed for those parameters. The remaining sample collected below the sample that was analyzed because it exhibited the highest PID reading/ stains and odors shall also only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs for Residential Properties and Construction Workers. If none of the detected parameters exceed TACO Tier 1 SROs, neither the 0-3 foot samples nor the samples collected below the sample that was initially analyzed shall be analyzed.

For the two (2) soil borings along the north side of the Daley Library building the sample that contained the highest PID reading/evidence of stains and odors shall be analyzed for BTEX and PNAs. If PID readings are at or below background, the soil sample shall be collected based on field determinations. If the analytical results of the sample analyzed for BTEX and PNAs contain detected levels of BTEX and PNAs that exceed TACO Tier 1 SRO for Residential Properties and Construction Workers, the 0-3 foot sample shall only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs. The remaining samples collected below the sample that was analyzed because it exhibited the highest PID reading/stains and odors shall also only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs for Residential Properties and Construction Workers. If none of the detected parameters exceed TACO Tier 1 SROs, neither the 0-3 foot samples nor the samples collected below the sample that was initially analyzed shall be analyzed.

For the one (1) soil boring within the Daley Library building the sample that contained the highest PID reading/evidence of stains and odors shall be analyzed for VOCs, SVOCs and PNAs. If PID readings are at or below background, the soil sample shall be collected based on field determinations. If the analytical results of the sample analyzed for VOCs, SVOCs and PNAs contain detected levels of VOCs, SVOCs and PNAs that exceed TACO Tier 1 SRO for Residential Properties and Construction Workers, the 0-3 foot sample shall only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs. The remaining samples collected below the sample that was analyzed because it exhibited the highest PID reading/stains and odors shall also only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs for Residential Properties and Construction Workers. If none of the detected parameters exceed TACO Tier 1 SROs, neither the 0-3 foot samples nor the samples collected below the sample that was initially analyzed shall be analyzed.

For the three (3) soil borings within the parking area along the public alley on the west side of the Daley Library building the sample that contained the highest PID reading/evidence of stains and odors shall be analyzed for VOCs, SVOCs and PNAs. If PID readings are at or below background, the soil sample shall be collected based on field determinations. If the analytical results of the sample analyzed for VOCs, SVOCs and PNAs contain detected levels of VOCs, SVOCs and PNAs that exceed TACO Tier 1 SRO for Residential Properties and Construction Workers, the 0-3 foot sample shall only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs. The remaining samples collected below the sample that was analyzed because it exhibited the highest PID reading/stains and odors shall also only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs, neither the 0-3 foot samples nor the samples collected below the sample that was initially analyzed shall be analyzed.

3410 S. Halsted - Former Furniture Building

For the one (1) soil boring on the east side of the former furniture building located at 3410 S. Halsted, the sample that exhibited the highest PID reading/evidence of stains and odors shall be analyzed for VOCs. If PID readings are at or below background, the soil sample shall be collected based on field determinations. If the analytical results of the sample analyzed for VOCs contain detected levels of VOCs that exceed TACO Tier 1 SRO for Residential Properties and Construction Workers, the 0-3 foot sample shall only be analyzed for those parameters. The remaining sample collected below the sample that was analyzed because it exhibited the highest PID reading and/or stains and odors shall also only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs for Residential Properties and Construction Workers. If none of the detected parameters exceed TACO Tier 1 SROs, neither the 0-3 foot sample nor the sample collected below the sample that was initially analyzed shall be analyzed.

For the one (1) soil boring near a vent pipe on the west side of the former furniture building located at 3410 S. Halsted, the 0-3 foot sample shall be analyzed for Lust Pollutant Analysis plus pH. If the analytical results of the sample analyzed for LUST Pollutants contain detected levels of LUST Pollutants that exceed TACO Tier 1 SRO for Residential Properties and Construction Workers, the field determined sample below the 0-3 foot depth shall only be analyzed for those LUST Pollutant parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs plus pH. If the sample analysis of the field determined soil sample collected below the 0-3 foot depth and analyzed for Pollutants exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs, the remaining sample shall only be analyzed for those

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parameters that exceeded TACO Residential and Construction Worker SROs plus pH. If none of the detected parameters from the 0-3 foot depth exceed TACO Tier 1 SROs, none of the samples below the 0-3 foot depth shall be analyzed.

For the one (1) soil boring inside the interior loading dock area associated with the furniture building located at 3410 S. Halsted, the 0-3 foot sample shall be analyzed for Lust Pollutant Analysis and pH. If the analytical results of the sample analyzed for LUST Pollutants contain detected levels of LUST Pollutants that exceed TACO Tier 1 SRO for Residential Properties and Construction Workers, the field determined sample below the 0-3 foot depth shall only be analyzed for those LUST Pollutant parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs plus pH. If the sample analysis of the field determined soil sample collected below the 0-3 foot depth and analyzed for LUST Pollutant parameters exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs, the remaining sample shall only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Residential and Construction Worker SROs plus pH. If none of the detected parameters from the soil sample collected from the 0-3 foot depth exceed TACO Tier 1 SROs, none of the samples below the 0-3 foot depth shall be analyzed.

For the one (1) wipe sample collected from the elevator's hydraulic system inside the former furniture building located at 3410 S. Halsted, the wipe samples shall be analyzed for PCBs.

For the one (1) soil boring in the vicinity of the elevator inside the former furniture building located at 3410 S. Halsted, the sample collected at the 0-3 foot depth shall be analyzed for BTEX, PNAs and Barium. The sample shall also be analyzed for PCBs if PCBs were detected in the wipe sample. If the analytical results of the sample analyzed for BTEX, PNAs, Barium and PCBs contain detected levels of parameters that exceed TACO Tier 1 SRO for Residential Properties and Construction Workers, the field determined sample below the 0-3 foot depth shall only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs plus pH. The remaining sample shall only be analyzed for those parameters that exceeded TACO Tier 1 SROs for Residential Properties and Construction Workers for BTEX, PNA and Barium. If none of the detected parameters from the soil sample collected from the 0-3 foot depth exceed TACO Tier 1 SROs, none of the samples below the 0-3 foot depth shall be analyzed.

All soil and wipe samples must be analyzed by an IEPA accredited laboratory and by approved IEPA analytical methods.

All samples shall be collected in approved laboratory containers and submitted to an IEPA-accredited environmental analytical laboratory following appropriate Chain-of-Custody procedures. Samples shall be analyzed within a standard 7 to 10 day turnaround period. Samples placed on hold for subsequent analysis shall not be allowed to exceed analytical holding times.

DELIVERABLES FOR TASK III: PHASE II ENVIRONMENTAL SITE ASSESSMENT

A Phase II ESA report will be prepared documenting the results of this investigation and providing recommendations as warranted. The Consultant shall provide two printed copies and one electronic copy (PDF and word format) of a "Draft Phase II Environmental Site Assessment Report" to the PBC for review and comment. The Consultant shall be prepared to conduct revisions to the document. The Consultant shall then provide two printed copies and one electronic copy (PDF format) of an "Interim Final Phase II Environmental Site Assessment Report" incorporating the comments on the "Draft Phase II Environmental Site Assessment Report" - to the PBC for review and comment. The Consultant shall then provide three printed copies and three electronic copies (PDF format) of a "Final Phase II Environmental Site Assessment Report" to the PBC.

Use of Report

The Public Building Commission of Chicago and the Chicago Public Library may produce the report without modifications and distribute the report in connection with the use or disposition of the property without incurring obligation for additional compensation.

The Project Manager's review and approval will address Consultant's compliance with the requirements of the Scope of Work; the Consultant is and will remain wholly liable for the accuracy and validity of the report.

Qualifications/Personnel

All work shall be performed by qualified personnel with the appropriate licenses as requested.

The Consultant must attach MBE and WBE utilization reports on the form entitled "Status Report of MBE and WBE Sub-Contract Payments", at the time of submitting each monthly invoice. The report should indicate the current and cumulative payments to the MBE and WBE sub-contractors.

The Consultant must provide and maintain at Consultant's own expense, until expiration or termination of the Agreement and during the time period following expiration if Consultant is required to return and perform any additional work, the minimum insurance coverage and requirements specified below, insuring all operations related to the Agreement.

D.1. INSURANCE TO BE PROVIDED

D.1.1. Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability

Workers' Compensation Insurance, as prescribed by applicable law covering all employees who are to provide a service under the Agreement and Employers Liability coverage with limits of not less than \$500,000 each accident, Illness or disease.

D.1.2. Commercial General Liability (Primary and Umbrella)

Commercial General Liability Insurance or equivalent with limits of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage liability. Coverage must include the following: All premises and operations, products/completed operations, separation of insureds, defense, and contractual liability (with no limitation endorsement). The Public Building Commission and City of Chicago must be named as additional insureds on a primary, non-contributory basis for any liability arising directly or indirectly from the work, including the two year completed operations period.

Subcontractors performing work for Consultant must maintain limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence with the same terms herein

D.1.3. Automobile Liability (Primary and Umbrella)

When any motor vehicles (owned, non-owned and hired) are used in connection with work to be performed, the Consultant must provide Automobile Liability Insurance, with limits of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. The Public Building Commission and the City of Chicago must be named as additional insureds on a primary, non-contributory basis.

Subcontractors performing work for Consultant must maintain limits of not less than $\frac{$1,000,000}{}$ per occurrence with the same terms herein

D.1.4. Professional Liability

When any professional Consultant performs work in connection with the Agreement, Professional Liability Insurance will be maintained with limits of not less than \$2,000,000 covering acts, errors, or omissions. When policies are renewed or replaced, the policy retroactive date must coincide with, or precede the, start of work on the Agreement. A claims-made policy, which is not renewed or replaced, must have an extended reporting period of two (2) years.

Subcontractors performing work for Consultant must maintain limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence with the same terms herein

D.1.5 Property

The Consultant is responsible for all loss or damage to Commission and/or City of Chicago property at full replacement or repair cost. The Consultant is responsible for all loss or damage to personal property (including but not limited to materials, equipment, tools, and supplies) owned, rented, or used by Consultant.

D.1.6 Valuable Papers

When any plans, designs, drawings, specifications, data, media, and documents are produced or used under this Agreement, Valuable Papers Insurance shall be maintained in an amount to insure against any loss whatsoever, and shall have limits sufficient to pay for the re-creation and reconstruction of such records.

D.1.7 Contractors Pollution Liability

When any work is performed which may cause a pollution exposure, Contractors Pollution is required with limits of not less than

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\$2,000,000 per occurrence for any portion of the services, which may entail, exposure to any pollutants, whether in the course of sampling, remedial work or any other activity under this contract. Policy must pay claims for bodily injury, property damage, clean up costs and other losses caused by pollution conditions that arise from the Contract scope of services, Contractors operations, and completed operations. Coverage must also include: transportation, contractual liability, defense, excavation, environmental cleanup, remediation and disposal. When policies are renewed or replaced, the policy retroactive date must coincide with or precede, start of work on the Contract. A claims-made policy, which is not renewed or replaced, must have an extended reporting period of two (2) years. The Public Building Commission and the City of Chicago are to be named as additional insureds on a primary, non-contributory basis.

Subcontractors performing work for Consultant must maintain limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence with the same terms herein

D.1.8 Railroad Protective Liability

When any work is to be done adjacent to or on railroad or transit property, Contractor must provide, with respect to the operations that Contractor or subcontractors perform, Railroad Protective Liability Insurance in the name of railroad or transit entity. The policy must have limits of not less than the requirement of the operating railroad/transit entity for losses arising out of injuries to or death of all persons, and for damage to or destruction of property, including the loss of use thereof.

D.2. **ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

The Consultant must furnish the Public Building Commission Procurement Department, Richard J. Daley Center, Room 200, Chicago, IL 60602, original Certificates of Insurance, or such similar evidence, to be in force on the date of this Agreement, and Renewal Certificates of Insurance, or such similar evidence, if any insurance coverage has an expiration or renewal date occurring during the term of this Agreement. The Consultant must submit evidence of insurance to the Commission before award of Agreement. The receipt of any certificate does not constitute agreement by the Commission that the insurance requirements in the Agreement have been fully met or that the insurance policies indicated on the certificate are in compliance with all Agreement requirements. The failure of the Commission to obtain certificates or other insurance evidence from Consultant is not a waiver by the Commission of any requirements for the Consultant to obtain and maintain the specified coverage. The Consultant will advise all insurers of the Agreement provisions regarding insurance. Non-conforming insurance does not relieve Consultant of the obligation to provide insurance as specified in this Agreement. Nonfulfillment of the insurance conditions may constitute a breach of the Agreement, and the Commission retains the right to stop work until proper evidence of insurance is provided, or the Agreement may be terminated.

The Commission reserves the right to obtain copies of insurance policies and records from the Consultant and/or its subcontractors at any time upon written request.

The insurance must provide for 60 days prior written notice to be given to the Commission if any policies are canceled, substantially changes, or non-renewed.

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions on referenced insurance must be borne by Consultant.

The Consultant hereby waives and agrees to cause all of its insurers to waive their rights of subrogation against the Commission and City of Chicago, their respective Board members, employees, elected and appointed officials, and representatives.

The insurance coverage and limits furnished by Consultant in no way limit the Consultant's liabilities and responsibilities specified within the Agreement or by law.

Any insurance or self-insurance programs maintained by the Commission and the City of Chicago do not contribute with insurance provided by the Consultant under the Agreement.

The required insurance to be carried is not limited by any limitations expressed in the indemnification language in this Agreement or any limitation placed on the indemnity in the Agreement given as a matter of law.

If Consultant is a joint venture or limited liability company, the insurance policies must name the joint venture or limited liability company as a named insured

The Consultant must require all its subcontractors to provide the insurance required in this Agreement, or Consultant may provide the coverage for its subcontractors. All subcontractors are subject to the same insurance requirements of Consultant unless otherwise specified in this Agreement.

EXHIBIT C

SPECIAL CONDITIONS REGARDING THE UTILIZATION OF MINORITY AND WOMEN OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISES FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

1. Policy Statement

- a. It is the policy of the Public Building Commission of Chicago ("PBC") to ensure competitive business opportunities for MBE and WBE firms in the performance of Contracts, to prohibit discrimination in the award of or participation in Contracts, and to abolish arbitrary barriers to full participation in Contracts by all persons, regardless of race, sex or ethnicity. Therefore, during the performance of this Contract, the Professional Service Provider must agree that it will not discriminate against any person or business on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry, age, marital status, physical or mental handicap, unfavorable discharge from military service, parental status, sexual orientation, national origin or sex, in the solicitation or the purchase of goods and services or the subcontracting of work in the performance in this Contract.
- b. The Commission requires the Professional Service Provider also agree to take affirmative action to ensure that MBE and WBE firms have the maximum opportunity to compete for and perform subcontracts with respect to this Contract.
- c. The Commission requires the Professional Service Provider to notify MBE and WBE firms, utilized on this contract, about opportunities on contracts without affirmative action goals.

2. Aspirational Goals

- a. Upon the effective date of these Special Conditions, the bi-annual aspirational goals are to award 25% of the annual dollar value of all Commission Construction Contracts to certified MBEs and 5% of the annual dollar value of all Commission Construction Contracts to qualified WBEs.
- b. Further, the Professional Service Provider must agree to use its best efforts to include MBE and WBE firms in any Contract modification work that increases the Contract value. Where the proposed contract modification involves work which can be performed by MBEs and WBEs already performing work on the contract such MBEs and WBEs will participate in such work specified in the contract modification..
- c. Failure to carry out the commitments and policies set forth in this Program constitute a material breach of contract and may result in termination of the Professional Service Provider or such other remedy, as the Commission deems appropriate.

3. Definitions

- a. For purposes of this Special Condition, the following definitions applies:
 - (1) "Certified Minority Business Enterprise" means a person or entity granted certification by the City of Chicago, County of Cook, Metropolitan Water Reclamation District, Chicago Minority Business Development Council, Central Management Service of the State of Illinois, METRA, and Women's Business Development Center.
 - (2) "Certified Women's Business Enterprise" means a person or entity granted certification by the City of Chicago, County of Cook, Metropolitan Water Reclamation District, Chicago Minority Business Development Council, Central Management Service of the State of Illinois, METRA, and Women's Business Development Center.
 - (3) "Professional Service Contract" means a contract for professional services of any type.
 - (4) "Contract Specific Goals" means the subcontracting goals for MBE and WBE participation established for a particular contract based upon the availability of MBEs and WBEs to perform and anticipated scope of work of the contract and the Commission's progress towards meeting the aspirational goals.
 - (5) "Professional Service Provider" means any person or business entity that seeks to enter into a Professional Service Contract with the Commission and includes all partners, affiliates and joint ventures of such person or entity.
- (6) "Executive Director" means the Executive Director of the Commission or his duly designated representative Phase II ENA & Phase II Environmental Services Page 25 of 33

- (7) "Good faith efforts" means actions undertaken by a Professional Service Provider to achieve a Contract Specific Goal that by their scope, intensity and appropriateness to the objective can reasonably be expected to fulfill the Program's requirements.
- (8) "Joint venture" means an association of two or more persons or entities or any combination of two or more business enterprises and persons numbering two or more, proposing to perform a single for-profit business enterprise, in which each joint venture partner contributes property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge, and in which the MBE or WBE is responsible for a distinct, clearly-defined portion of the work of the contract and whose share in the capital contribution, control, management, risks and profits of the joint venture is equal to its ownership interest. Joint ventures must have an agreement in writing specifying the terms and conditions of the relationships between the parties and their relationship and responsibilities to the contract.

(9) "Minority" means:

- a. Any individual in the following racial or ethnic groups, members of which are rebuttably presumed to be socially disadvantaged:
 - African-Americans or Blacks, which includes persons having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa;
 - Hispanics, which includes persons of Spanish culture with origins in Mexico, South or Central America or the Caribbean Islands, regardless of race; and
- b. Individual members of other groups, including but not limited to Asian-Americans, Arab-Americans and Native-Americans, found by the Commission to be socially disadvantaged by having suffered racial or ethnic prejudice or cultural bias within American society, without regard to individual qualities, resulting in decreased opportunities to compete in Chicago area markets or to do business with the Commission.
- (10) "Minority-owned business enterprise" or "MBE" means a small local business enterprise which is at least 51% owned by one or more economically disadvantaged minority persons, or in the case of a publicly held corporation at least 51% of all classes of the stock of which is owned by one or more economically disadvantaged minority persons whose management, policies, major decisions and daily business operations are independently managed and controlled by one or more economically disadvantaged minority persons.
- (11) "Program" means the minority- and women-owned business enterprise construction procurement program established in this special condition.
- (12) "Women-owned business enterprise" or "WBE" means a small local business enterprise which is at least 51% owned by one or more economically disadvantaged women or in the case of a publicly owned business, at least 51% of all classes of the stock of which is owned by one or more economically disadvantaged women, whose management, policies, major decisions and daily business operations are independently managed and controlled by one or more economically disadvantaged women.

4. Determining MBE/WBE Utilization

The methodology for determining MBE and WBE utilization will be determined for purposes of analysis with respect to this contract as follows:

- a. The total dollar value of the contract awarded to the certified MBE or WBE firm will be credited to such participation. Only minority business participation may be counted toward MBE participation and only women business participation may be counted toward WBE participation.
- b. The total dollar value of a contract with a firm owned and controlled by minority women is counted toward either the MBE or WBE goal, but not both. The Professional Service Provider employing the firm may choose the goal to which the contract value is applied. Various work done by one and the same sub-consultant will be considered, for the purpose of this principle, as work effectively done under one subcontract only, which sub-consultant may be counted toward only one of the goals, not toward both.
- c. A Professional Service Provider may count toward its MBE or WBE goal the portion of the total dollar value of a contract with an eligible joint venture equal to the percentage of the ownership and control of the MBE or WBE

partner in the joint venture. A joint venture seeking to be credited for MBE participation may be formed among certified MBE and WBE firms, or between certified MBE and WBE firms and a non-MBE/WBE firm. A joint venture satisfies the eligibility standards of this Program if the certified MBE or WBE participant of the joint venture:

- (1) Shares in the ownership, control, management responsibilities, risks and profits of the joint venture; and
- (2) Is responsible for a clearly defined portion of work to be performed in proportion to the MBE or WBE ownership percentage.
- d. A Professional Service Provider may count toward its MBE and WBE goals only expenditures to firms that perform a commercially useful function in the work of a contract. A firm is considered to perform a commercially-useful function when it is responsible for execution of a distinct element of the work of a contract and carries out its responsibilities by actually performing, managing, and supervising the work involved. To determine whether a firm is performing a commercially useful function, the Commission will evaluate the amount of work subcontracted, industry practices and other relevant factors.
- e. Consistent with normal industry practices, a MBE or WBE firm may enter into subcontracts. If a MBE or WBE Professional Service Provider subcontracts a significantly greater portion of the work of a contract than would be expected on the basis of normal industry practices, the MBE or WBE will be rebuttably presumed not to be performing a commercially-useful function.
- f. A Professional Service Provider may count toward its goals expenditures to MBE or WBE manufacturers (i.e., suppliers that produce goods from raw materials or substantially alters them before resale).
- g. A Professional Service Provider may count toward its goals expenditures to MBE or WBE suppliers provided that the supplier performs a commercially useful function in the supply process.

5. Submission of Proposals

- a. The following schedules and documents constitute the Proposer's MBE/WBE compliance proposal and must be submitted at the time of the proposal.
 - (1) Evidence of Certification: Affidavit of MBE/WBE. A copy of each proposed MBE and WBE firm's Letter of Certification from the City of Chicago, Department of Procurement Services or any other entity accepted by the Public Building Commission of Chicago must be submitted. The PBC certification by the City of Chicago, County of Cook, Metropolitan Water Reclamation District, Chicago Minority Business Development Council, Central Management Service of the State of Illinois, METRA, and Women's Business Development Center.
 - (2) Schedule B: Affidavit of MBE/Non-MBE or WBE/Non-WBE Joint Ventures. Where the Proposer's MBE/WBE compliance proposal includes participation of any MBE or WBE as a joint venture participant, the Proposer must submit a "Schedule B: Affidavit of MBE/Non-MBE or WBE/Non-WBE Joint Venture" with an attached copy of the joint venture agreement proposed among the parties. The Schedule B and the joint venture agreement must clearly evidence that the MBE or WBE participant will be responsible for a clearly defined portion of the work to be performed and that the MBE or WBE firm's responsibilities are in proportion with its ownership percentage.
 - (3) Schedule C: Letter of Intent to Perform as a sub-consultant, Subconsultant, or Material Supplier, Schedule C, executed by the MBE/WBE firm (or Joint Venture sub-consultant) must be submitted by the Proposer for each MBE/WBE included on the Schedule D. Schedule C must accurately detail the work to be performed by the MBE or WBE firm and the agreed rates and prices to be paid.
 - (4) Schedule D: Affidavit of Prime Professional Service Provider Regarding MBE or WBE Utilization. A completed Schedule D committing to the utilization of each listed MBE or WBE firm. Unless the Proposer has submitted a completed request for a waiver of participation by MBE/WBE firms (See Request for Waiver procedures in Section 7), the Proposer must include the specific dollar amount or percentage of participation of each MBE/WBE firm listed on its Schedule D. The total dollar commitment to proposed MBE firms must at least equal the MBE goal, and the total dollar commitment to proposed WBE firms must at least equal the WBE goal. Proposers are responsible for calculating the dollar equivalent of MBE or WBE utilization as percentages of their total proposal.
- b. The submittals must have all blank spaces on the Schedule pages applicable to the contract correctly filled in. Agreements between a Proposer and a MBE/WBE in which the MBE/WBE promises not to provide subcontracting quotations to other Proposers are prohibited.

6. Evaluation of Compliance Proposals

- a. The Proposer's MBE/WBE compliance proposal will be evaluated by the Commission. The Proposer agrees to provide, upon request, earnest and prompt cooperation to the Executive Director or his designee in submitting to interviews that may be necessary, in allowing entry to places of business, in providing further documentation, or in soliciting the cooperation of a proposed MBE or WBE firm in providing such assistance. A proposal may be treated as non-responsive by reason of the determination that the Proposer's proposal did not contain a sufficient level of Certified MBE or WBE participation, that the Proposer was unresponsive or uncooperative when asked for further information relative to the proposal, or that false statements were made in the Schedules.
- b. If the Commission's review of a Proposer's proposal concludes that the MBE or WBE proposal was deficient, the Commission will promptly notify the Proposer of the apparent deficiency and instruct the Proposer to submit (within 3 business days of such notice given by the Commission) a modification of the MBE or WBE Proposal, in proper format, which remedies the deficiencies cited. Failure to correct all deficiencies cited by the Commission will be cause for rejection of the Proposer's proposal as non-responsive.
- c. Proposers will not be permitted to modify their MBE/WBE compliance proposal except insofar as directed to do so by the Commission. Therefore, all terms and conditions stipulated for prospective MBE and WBE consultants or suppliers should be satisfactorily negotiated prior to the submission to the Commission of the Proposer's MBE/WBE compliance proposal. If circumstances should arise, however, where a proposed MBE/WBE is no longer available, the process described in Section 12 should be followed.

7. Request for Waiver

- a. If a Proposer is unable to identify qualified MBE and WBE firms to perform sufficient work to fulfill the MBE or WBE percentage goals for this Contract, the proposal must include a written request for waiver. A request for waiver must be sent to the Executive Director and must set forth the Proposer's inability to obtain sufficient MBE and WBE firms notwithstanding good faith attempts to achieve such participation.
- b. Good Faith efforts to achieve participation include but are not limited to:
 - (1) Attendance at the Pre-proposal conference:
 - (2) The Proposer's general affirmative action policies regarding the utilization of MBE and WBE firms, plus a description of the methods used to carry out those policies;
 - (3) Advertisement in trade association newsletters and minority and woman-oriented and general circulation media for specific sub-consultants;
 - (4) Timely notification of specific sub-consultants to minority and woman assistance agencies and associations;
 - (5) Description of direct negotiations with MBE and WBE firms for specific sub-consultants, including:
 - i. The name, address and telephone number of MBE and WBE firms contacted;
 - ii. A description of the information provided to MBE and WBE firms regarding the portions of the work to be performed; and
 - iii. The reasons why additional MBE and WBE firms were not obtained in spite of negotiations.
 - (6) A statement of the efforts made to select portions of the work proposed to be performed by MBE and WBE firms (such as sub-supplier, transport, engineering, distribution, or any other roles contributing to production and delivery as specified in the contract) in order to increase the likelihood of achieving sub participation.
 - (7) As to each MBE and WBE contacted which the Proposer considers to be not qualified, a detailed statement of the reasons for the Proposer's conclusion.
 - (8) Efforts made by the Proposer to expand its search for MBE and/or WBE firms beyond usual geographic boundaries.
 - (9) General efforts made to assist MBE and WBE firms to overcome participation barriers.
- c. The Executive Director, after review and evaluation of the request provided by the Proposer, may grant a waiver request upon the determination that:

- (1) Sufficient qualified MBE and/or WBE firms capable of providing the goods or services required by the contract are unavailable despite the good faith efforts of the Proposer;
- (2) The price(s) quoted by potential MBE and/or WBE firms for goods or services is above competitive levels to an extent unwarranted by any increased cost of doing business attributable to the present effects of disadvantage or discrimination.

Failure To Achieve Goals

- a. If the Professional Service Provider cannot achieve the contract specific goals, as the Project proceeds, it must have documented its good faith efforts to do so. In determining whether the Professional Service Provider has made such good faith efforts, the performance of other Professional Service Providers in meeting the goals may be considered. The Executive Director or his designee shall consider, at a minimum, the Professional Service Provider's efforts to do the following:
 - (1) Soliciting through reasonable and available means the interest of MBEs or WBEs that Provide interested MBEs or WBEs with adequate information about the plans, specifications and requirements of the contract, including addenda, in a timely manner to assist them in responding to the solicitation.
 - (2) Provide interested MBEs or WBEs with adequate information about the plans, specifications and requirements of the contract, including addenda, in a timely manner to assist them in responding to the solicitation.
 - (3) Negotiating in good faith with interested MBEs or WBEs that have submitted proposals. Documentation of negotiation must include the names, addresses and telephone numbers of MBEs or WBEs that were solicited; the date of each such solicitation; a description of the information provided regarding the plans and specifications for the work selected for subcontracting; and evidence as to why agreements could not be reached with MBEs or WBEs to perform the work. That there may be some additional costs involved in solicitation and using MBEs and WBEs is not a sufficient reason for a Professional Service Provider's failure to meet the goals, as long as such costs are reasonable.
 - (4) Not rejecting MBEs or WBEs as being unqualified without sound reasons based on the thorough investigation of a their capabilities. The MBEs' or WBEs' standing within its industry, membership in specific groups, organizations, or associations and political or social affiliations are not legitimate cases for rejecting or not soliciting proposals to meet the goals.
 - (5) Making a portion of the work available to MBE or WBE sub=consultants and suppliers and to select those portions of the work or material consistent with the available MBE or WBE sub-consultants and suppliers, so as to facilitate meeting the goals.
 - (6) Making good faith efforts despite the ability or desire of a Professional Service Provider to perform the work of a contract with its own organization. A Professional Service Provider that desires to self-perform the work of a contract must demonstrate good faith efforts unless the goals have been met.
 - (7) Selecting portions of the work to be performed by MBEs or WBEs in order to increase the likelihood that the goals will be met. This includes, where appropriate, breaking out contract work items into economically feasible units to facilitate MBE or WBE participation even when the Contract might otherwise prefer to perform these items with its own forces.
 - (8) Making efforts to assist interested MBEs or WBEs in obtaining bonding lines of credit or insurance as required by the Commission or Professional Service Provider.
 - (9) Making efforts to assist interested MBEs or WBEs in obtaining necessary equipment, supplies, materials or related assistance or services, including participation in a mentor-protégée program; and
 - (10) Effectively using the services of the Commission; minority or women community organizations; minority or women groups; local, state and federal minority or women business assistance offices; and other organizations to provide assistance in the recruitment and placement of MBEs or WBEs.
- b. In the event the Public Building Commission Procurement Officer determines that the Professional Service Provider did not make a good faith effort to achieve the goals, the Professional Service Provider may file a Dispute to the Executive Director as provided in Section 11 of the Terms and Agreements.
- Reporting and Record-Keeping Requirements

- **a**. The Professional Service Provider, within 5 working days of contract award, must execute a formal subcontract or purchase order in compliance with the terms of the Professional Service Provider's proposal and MBE/WBE assurances. Upon request by the PBC, the Professional Service Provider must provide copies of the contracts or purchase orders executed between it and the MBE and WBE firms. During the performance of the contract, the Professional Service Provider will submit partial and final walvers of lien from MBE and WBE sub-consultant and suppliers indicating the current payment amount and the cumulative dollar amount of payments made to date.
- b. The Professional Service Provider must maintain records of all relevant data with respect to the utilization of MBE and WBE firms, including without limitation payroll records, tax returns and records, and books of account in such detail as the Commission requires, and retain such records for a period of at least 3 years after final acceptance of the work. Full access to such records will be granted to the Commission and/or its designees, on 5 business days' notice in order for the Commission to determine the Professional Service Provider's compliance with its MBE and WBE commitments and the status of any MBE or WBE firm performing any portion of the contract.
- The Professional Service Provider will file regular MBE and WBE utilization reports on the form entitled "Status C. Report of MBE and WBE Sub-Contract Payments", at the time of submitting each monthly invoice. The report should indicate the current and cumulative payments to t MBE and WBE sub-contractors.

10. Disqualification of MBE or WBE

The Contract may be terminated by the Executive Director upon the disqualification of the Professional Service Provider as an MBE or WBE if the sub-consultants status as an MBE or WBE was a factor in the award and such status was misrepresented by the Professional Service Provider.

The Contract may be terminated by the Executive Director upon the disqualification of any MBE or WBE if the subconsultants or supplier's status as an MBE or WBE was a factor in the award of the contract and the status of the sub-consultant or supplier was misrepresented by the Professional Service Provider. If the Professional Service Provider is determined not to have been involved in any misrepresentation of the status of the disqualified subconsultant or supplier, the Professional Service Provider shall make good faith efforts to engage a qualified MBE or WBE replacement.

11. Prohibition On Changes To MBE/WBE Commitments

The Professional Service Provider must not make changes to its contractual MBE and WBE commitments or substitute such MBE or WBE sub-consultants without the prior written approval of the Executive Director. Unauthorized changes or substitutions, including performing the work designated for a sub-consultant with the Professional Service Provider's own forces, is a violation of this section and a breach of the contract with the Commission, and may cause termination of the contract for breach, and/or subject the Professional Service Provider to contract remedies or other sanctions. The facts supporting the request must not have been known nor reasonably should have been known by the parties prior to entering into the subcontract.

12. MBE/WBE Substitution Requirements and Procedures

- Arbitrary changes by the Professional Service Provider of the commitments earlier certified in the Schedule D are a. prohibited. Further, after once entering into each approved MBE and WBE sub-contract agreement, the Professional Service Provider shall thereafter neither terminate the subcontract, nor reduce the scope of the work to be performed by the MBE or WBE, nor decrease the price to the MBE or WBE, without in each instance receiving the prior written approval of the Executive Director. In some cases, however, it may become necessary to substitute a new MBE or WBE in order to actually fulfill the MBE or WBE requirements. In such cases, the Executive Director must be given reasons justifying the release by the Professional Service Provider of prior specific MBE or WBE commitments established in the contract, and will need to review the eligibility of the MBE or WBE presented as a substitute. The substitution procedure will be as follows:
 - The Professional Service Provider must notify the Executive Director immediately in writing of an apparent necessity to reduce or terminate a MBE or WBE subcontract and to propose a substitute firm for some phase of work, if needed in order to sustain the fulfillment of the MBE/WBE contract requirements.
 - The Professional Service Provider's notification should include the specific reasons for the proposed substitution. Stated reasons which would be acceptable include any of the following reasons: a) Unavailability after receipt of reasonable notice to proceed; b) failure of performance; c)financial incapacity; d) refusal by the sub-

consultant to honor the proposal price or scope; e) mistake of fact or law about the elements of the scope of work of a solicitation where a reasonable price cannot be agreed; f) failure of the sub-consultant to meet insurance, licensing or bonding requirements; g) the sub-consultant's withdrawal of its proposal; or h) decertification of the sub-consultant as MBE or WBE.

(3) The Professional Service Provider's position must be fully explained and supported with adequate documentation. Stated reasons which will not be acceptable include: replacement firm has been recruited to perform the same work under terms more advantageous to the Professional Service Provider; issues about performance by the committed MBE or WBE were disputed (unless every reasonable effort has already been taken to have the issues resolved or mediated satisfactorily); an MBE or WBE has requested reasonable price escalation which may be justified due to unforeseen circumstances.

The Profession Service Provider's notification should include the names, address and principal official of any proposed substitute MBE or WBE and the dollar value and scope of work of the proposed subcontract. Attached should be all the same MBE/WBE affidavits, documents and Letters of Intent which are required of the proposed MBE or WBE firms.

- (4) The Executive Director will evaluate the submitted documentation, and respond within fifteen (15) working days to the request for approval of a substitution. The response may be in the form of requesting more information, or requesting an interview to clarify or mediate the problem. In the case of an expressed emergency need to receive the necessary decision for the sake of job progress, the Executive Director will instead respond as soon as practicable.
- (5) Actual substitution of a replacement MBE or WBE to fulfill contract requirements must not be made before the Executive Director's approval is given of the acceptability of the substitute MBE or WBE. This subcontract must be executed within five (5) working days, and a copy of the MBE WBE subcontract with signatures of both parties to the agreement should be submitted immediately to the Executive Director.
- b. The Executive Director will not approve extra payment for escalated costs incurred by the Professional Service Provider when a substitution of sub-consultants becomes necessary for the Professional Service Provider in order to comply with MBE/WBE contract requirements.
- c. No relief of the MBE/WBE requirements will be granted by the Executive Director except in exceptional circumstances. Requests for complete or partial waiver of the MBE/WBE requirements of this contract must be made in writing, stating all details of the request, the circumstances, and any additional relevant information. The request must be accompanied by a record of all efforts taken by the Professional Service Provider to locate specific firms, solicit MBE and WBE proposals, seek assistance from technical assistance agencies, and other good faith efforts undertaken to achieve compliance with the MBE/WBE goals.

13. Non-Compliance

- a. The Executive Director has the authority to apply suitable sanctions to the Professional Service Provider if the Professional Service Provider is found to be in non-compliance with the MBE and WBE requirements. Failure to comply with the MBE or WBE terms of this contract or failure to use MBE or WBE firms as stated in the Professional Service Provider's assurances constitutes a material breach of the contract, and may lead to the suspension or termination of the contract in part or in whole. In some cases, monthly progress payments may be withheld until corrective action is taken.
- b. When the contract is completed, if the Executive Director has determined that the Professional Service Provider did not comply in the fulfillment of the required MBE and/or WBE goals, and a grant of relief of the requirements was not obtained, the Commission will be damaged in the failure to provide the benefit of participation to minority or women business to the degree set forth in this Special Condition. In that case, the Commission may disqualify the Professional Service Provider from entering into future contracts with the Commission.

Severability

 a. If any section, subsection, paragraph, clause, provision or application of these Special Conditions is held invalid by any count, the invalidity of such section, paragraph, clause or provision will not affect any of the remaining provisions hereof.

A person who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct texpayer identification number (TIN) to report, for example, income paid to you, real estate transactions, mortgage interest you paid, acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, or contributions you made to an IRA.

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN to the person requesting it (the requester) and, when applicable, to:

- Certify that the TIN you are giving is correct (or you are waiting for a number to be issued),
 - 2. Certify that you are not subject to backup withholding, or
- 3. Claim exemption from backup withholding if you are a U.S. exempt payee. If applicable, you are also certifying that as a U.S. person, your allocable share of any partnership income from a U.S. trade or business is not subject to the withholding tex on foreign partners' share of effectively connected income.

Note. If a requester gives you a form other than Form W-9 to request your TIN, you must use the requester's form if it is substantially similar to this Form W-9.

Definition of a U.S. person. For federal fax purposes, you are considered a U.S. person if you are:

- Ari individual who is a U.S. citizen or U.S. resident alien.
- A partnership, corporation, company, or association created or organized in the United States or under the laws of the United States,
- An estate (other than a foreign estate), or
- A domestic trust (as defined in Regulations section)

Special rules for partnerships. Partnerships that conduct a trade or business in the United States are generally required to pay a withholding tax on any foreign partners' share of income from such business. Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, a partnership is required to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid withholding on your share of partnership income.

The person who gives Form W-9 to the partnership for purposes of establishing its U.S. status and avoiding withholding on its allocable share of net income from the partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States is in the following cases:

The U.S. owner of a disregarded entity and not the entity,
