

The PBC has been authorized to spend \$190,482,546 on four school projects opened in 2012 to date. Due to exceptional cost performance, these projects are under budget by \$38,974,208 or 20.46%.

Economic Sustainability Program

We promote excellence in cost and schedule performance and include contractual requirements that add value to the taxpayers in a way that only public development can offer. As such, contractors are required to comply with various contract provisions intended to promote economic sustainability. Those provisions are as follows:

- Contract provisions that require that at least 50% of the labor force be local residents;
- Contract provisions that require community hiring; helping to employ those closest to the work at hand;
- Local business contract provisions that require Chicago General Contractors awarded PBC projects to subcontract at least 25% of the contract worth to Chicago subcontractors. General Contractors not located in Chicago must award at least 35% of the work to local subcontractors
- Contract provisions that require minority-and women-owned (M/WBE) business participation.
- Bid incentives for the employment of apprentices;
- Bid incentives for the employment of minority and female workers;
