The meeting was called to order by Chairman Johnson, and the presence of a quorum was established. Chairman Johnson then advised that a public participation period would be conducted pursuant to Section 2.06(g) of the Open Meetings Act and the guidelines for comments established by Resolution No. 7611 approved by the Board of Commissioners on January 11, 2011. Executive Director Giderof summarized the public comment guidelines which include the following: (1) the public comment period provides an opportunity for participants to share their comments with the Board of Commissioners; (2) participants must register at least two (2) hours in advance and are allowed two (2) minutes to provide comments; (3) all public

comments must be limited to issues of concern before the Board of Commissioners or its Committees; (4) remarks of a personal nature directed toward a member of the Board of Commissioners, employees of the Public Building Commission or any individual will not be tolerated; and (5) conduct or behavior that is not respectful or in violation of the Public Building Commission's anti-harassment policy will not be tolerated.

The following individuals had registered to provide comments during the public participation period: Jessica Jackson; Zoe Leigh; and Kenneth Newman. Jessica Jackson provided comments regarding the impact of the Malcolm X College project and other new projects on the ownership of property in various communities. Zoe Leigh provided comments regarding jobs and manufacturing in various communities and the need for new leadership. Kenneth Newman provided comments on the need for upgraded and additional athletic facilities in the City of Chicago.

Following the conclusion of the public participation period, the Commissioners were presented with consideration of approval of the minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Board of Commissioners held January 13, 2026. The reading of said minutes, which had previously been distributed, was dispensed with and upon motion duly made and seconded, the minutes of the January 13, 2026 board meeting were unanimously approved.

Next, the Commissioners were presented with a report by Commissioner Maldonado regarding the Administrative Operations Committee held on March 5, 2026. The Administrative Operations Committee report is summarized as follows:

The Director of Procurement presented one task order award for Environmental Renovation/Demolition Specialty Consultant Services and two task order awards for Material Testing Services.

The Director of Procurement reported on the assignment of a Professional Service Agreement for Server Migration and Network Services to the PBC.

The Executive Director reported on two Field Orders and recommended the ratification of Change Orders as follows:

- Kenwood Academy Link and Mechanical Project in the amount of \$51,550.45.
- Dett Elementary School Annex and Renovation Project in the credit amount of (\$208,693.18).
- CDOT WPA Street Reconstruction Projects at East 109th Street, South Hoyne and Harding Avenues, and East 102nd Street in the credit amount of (\$833,000.00) and at South Central Park Avenue and East 91st Street in the credit amount of (\$577,762.64).
- CDOT Capital Program Alleys Package 3, at various locations, in the credit amount of (\$153,498.28).

The Executive Director also provided updates on various outreach opportunities.

The AO Committee accepted the recommendations and reports from the PBC representative.

A copy of the Task Order Report is attached hereto as **Exhibit “A”**.

Next, the Commissioners were presented with consideration of approval of the acquisition of Synapse Networks, Inc. (“Synapse Network”) by Synapse Tech, LLC. (“Synapse Tech”). The Executive Director advised the Commissioners that, effective January 1, 2026, Synapse Tech acquired the business operations and assets of Synapse Networks, which is the current consultant under Contract PS1996 with the Public Building Commission for Server Migration and Maintenance Services. As the successor to Synapse Networks, Synapse Tech has agreed to adopt and comply with all terms and conditions of existing Contract PS1996, retain all existing employees of Synapse Networks without disruption or interruption, and to continue to provide services to the Public Building Commission with all required insurance and other contract requirements. Thereupon, the Executive Director recommended that the Board of Commissioners approve the acquisition of Synapse Networks by Synapse Tech. Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted.

The next item on the agenda was a report by the Executive Director regarding regular reports, development status and other matters. He advised the Commissioners regarding the following Public Building Commission activities and events that have occurred since the last board meeting:

- On January 28, 2026, the PBC hosted an Aldermanic Update meeting with 16th Ward Alderman Stephanie Coleman, the City Colleges of Chicago and the Burling Builders Design Build team regarding the School of Nursing project at Kennedy King College. The project, located at 63rd and Halsted, involves the conversion of the existing Second Floor Library into a nursing program.

Through the PBC student hiring initiative, the design builder for the School of Nursing project hired Antoine Young, a CPS Chicago Builds Program graduate who will soon graduate from Dawson Tech Institute and is an alumnus of Gwendolyn Brooks College Prep Academy. The PBC is pleased to see this Chicago Builds graduate and Dawson Tech Scholar begin working on the Program.

- On January 29, 2026, in partnership with the Department of Water and the 45th Ward, Alderman James Gardner, the Public Building Commission hosted a Pre-Submission Conference for Design Build Services for the Water Department's new operations facility located at 4825 W. Lawrence Avenue. The Pre-Submission Conferences provided information to those interested in actively pursuing procurement opportunities for the project. The Pre-Submission

Conference attracted over 80 participants and resulted in the receipt of multiple responses for this procurement.

- On February 25, 2026, the Public Building Commission celebrated the 100th anniversary of Black History Month by joining together for an inspirational presentation from performance artist, professional poet, and writer Umguchi, who read a passage from her latest book and performed a traditional Nigerian song. Special thanks were extended by the Executive Director to Public Building Commission staff for their efforts in organizing the program.
- On March 4, 2026, the Public Building Commission attended the Annual Membership Awards Gala to support one of its assist agencies, the African American Contractors Association. The Gala was held at the South Shore Cultural Center and provided information regarding procurement opportunities to work on PBC projects. The Executive Director noted that the next Assist Agency Conference will be held on March 24, 2026.
- On March 5, 2026, as part of the Public Building Commission's ongoing Student Hiring Initiative, the Design Build Team of BOWA/FGM hosted a student career outreach event for the Kells Park Fieldhouse project. The outreach event was conducted at the Salvation Army Freedom Center located at 825 North Christiana Avenue. Students and scholars from Walter Payton Colleg Prep High School and from Dawson Tech Institute attended and were provided information about career paths in the Architecture and Construction industries. The students and scholars also participated in a case study regarding the various stages of project development from design through construction.

- Also on March 5, 2026, the United States Army Corps of Engineers hosted the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) Public Meeting for the Morgan Shoal Revetment Reconstruction Project. The NEPA public meeting was held at Kennicott Park located at 4434 South Lake Park Avenue. Representatives from the Public Building Commission, the Chicago Park District along with the Chicago Department of Transportation attended the meeting to support the United States Army Corps of Engineers in its presentation. In addition, Commissioner Randall and Commissioner Ellis attended the meeting. The Executive Director extended special thanks to Commissioner Randall, Commissioner Ellis, the Chicago Park District, Chicago Department of Transportation and the entire United States Army Corps of Engineers team for their continued partnership.
- On May 14, 2026, the Public Building Commission will host its Annual Connection Session at Malcolm X College. The event will provide attendees with information regarding upcoming Public Building Commission procurement opportunities, encourage industry-wide networking among Contractors and Professional Service Providers, Assist Agencies and M/WBE firms, subcontractors, vendors and suppliers with a focus on the PBC's Student Hiring Initiative.
- Finally, the Executive Director extended an acknowledgement of the Celebration of Women's History Month.

At the conclusion of the remarks and acknowledgements, the report by the Executive Director was accepted.

The final item on the agenda was consideration of approval of a Revised Undertaking Request from the City Colleges of Chicago for the Malcolm X College West Campus Addition

and Renovation Project located at 4624 West Madison Street (the “Project”). The Executive Director advised the Commissioners that the City Colleges has submitted an amended resolution which provides authority for a Revised Undertaking of \$19,500,000 based on the current scope, schedule and budget associated with the confirmed construction and professional services for the Project, including work required for the addition and renovation of the existing facility. The Project will proceed under the 2023 Master Intergovernmental Agreement between the Public Building Commission and City Colleges, with funds to be identified and coordinated by City Colleges. Upon motion duly made and seconded, the following resolution was adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the Public Building Commission hereby approves the Revised Undertaking Request from the City Colleges of Chicago for the Malcolm X College (MXC) West Campus Addition and Renovations Project located at 4624 W. Madison Street in the amount of \$19,500,000 inclusive of the Undertaking Budget previously approved.

In 2023, the PBC publicly advertised Requests for Qualifications (RFQ) from firms interested in providing consulting services in the following categories: Environmental Renovation/Demolition Services, Construction Material Testing and Inspection Services, among others. In November 2023, the PBC received approval to award term contracts to firms pre-qualified to provide specialty consulting services in this category among others.

In November 2023, a random lottery by category was conducted to establish the rotation to accommodate the recent addition of firms. 





On May 5, 2025, the Public Building Commission of Chicago (PBC) issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) to Princeton Technical Services to provide Construction Materials Testing and Inspection Services for the above-referenced project. The requested services include testing and inspection for the following divisions:

- Division 03 – Concrete
- Division 07 – Thermal and Moisture Protection
- Division 31 – Earthwork
- Division 32 – Exterior Improvements

The project, located at McGinnis Field Station – 13700 S. 110th Avenue, Orland Park, IL, includes the construction of a new metal storage building, site improvements, electrical service upgrades, and minor renovations to existing field and lab buildings.

On May 12, 2025, Princeton Technical Services submitted a proposal in response to the RFP. The proposal included a detailed cost breakdown, technical scope, personnel qualifications, insurance certificates, and MBE/WBE documentation. Total Lump Sum Amount: \$42,962.50

Based on the review of the proposal, we recommend that Princeton Technical Services be selected to complete the work, based on the following:

- Demonstrated capability and experience in performing materials testing and inspection services on PBC projects;
- Clear understanding of the project scope and testing requirements;
- Qualified team, including certified inspectors and licensed Professional Engineer;
- Competitive and reasonable pricing structure;
- Prequalified specialty consultant in good standing with PBC; and
- Commitment to comply with the PBC's MBE/WBE participation goals.

Princeton Technical Services should be issued a Task Order in the lump sum amount of \$42,962.50 to complete the Construction Materials Testing and Inspection Services for the FPDCC Metal Buildings (McGinnis) project.
